TANGO 'BUSINESS TRIPS' LED TO DIVORCE COURT

Mrs. Magee Gets \$100 a Month Alimony, Although Husband Says His Salary is Only \$45.

Belmont Burdette Magee is a man of many business engagements. He is an architect and builder, doing business in Manhattan, and an auto is required to enable him to make his rounds.

According to statements his wife says he made to her, all day, and sometimes all night, was required to finish the business of his firm.

But his wife, Florence Deems Magee, also says his associates in his so-called engagements were women, and has brought suit for divorce.

To-day, in Brooklyn, Justice Benedict allowed the wife \$100 a month alimony and \$500 counsel fees.

Many of Magee's trips, his wife says, were made to tango halls.

This in the face of Magee's assertion that his father, a rich man in Great Neck, allows him only \$15 a week for conducting the affairs of his firm.

The firm is losing money. He says he has to pay his father \$8 a week for board, and that he gives his wife the other \$7.

Mrs. Magee has also sued her father-in-law for \$50,000 for alienating her husband's affections. The couple have been married four years and have two children.

TWO HURT IN CAR CRASH.

Trolley Smashes Into Repair Truck in Yonkers.

Two men were seriously injured today in a collision between a trolley car and a motor repair truck of the Union Railway in Central avenue, south of Jerome avenue, Yonkers.

The victims were John Quigley of No. 283 East One Hundred and Fifty-third street, motor man of the trolley car, and John McPhillips, an electrician.

It may be necessary to amputate Quigley's right leg and McPhillips' right leg in fracture.

The motor truck, of the type carrying an elevated platform, was across the trolley tracks, and McPhillips was on top of the platform working on the trolley wire.

The trolley car came down a steep grade. Quigley stuck to his seat, but was unable to avert the collision.

McPhillips leaped to the street. The injured men were taken in a motor truck to Fordham Hospital, in the Bronx.



