



LEFT BENEFACTOR DYING FROM BLOW OF BIG HAMMER

G. A. R. Veteran Found in Polish Home, a Victim of Assault and Robbery.

George W. Roger, a Grand Army veteran, was found at 11 o'clock this morning in a room at the Polish Immigrant Home, No. 188 Second avenue. A blood-stained carpenter's hammer on the floor showed the method of the would-be murderer. The old soldier was still alive and was hurried to Bellevue Hospital, where it was said that he could not possibly survive.

Roger is seventy-two years old. He appeared at the home yesterday afternoon in company with Franz Grabowski, a young Polish. They registered from Boston, Conn., and the old man said that they had come to New York to have the young man's left eye treated, the cornea having been injured from the blow of a stick. They said that they were going to one of the eye and ear hospitals on the avenue, but did not say which one.

They were an oddly assorted couple, but all kinds of people go to the Home and no further attention was paid to them. The younger man was rippant in his manner, according to Kasimir Jaworowski, manager of the institution.

"Charge the old skinnit 75 cents a day and me 25 cents," the manager says Grabowski said to him. "I told him that I would do nothing of the kind," said the manager this morning. "I told him that all people were treated alike in this place."

The two men went out about an hour after their arrival. They wanted to know if they could have dinner at 7 o'clock and were told that the dining room was closed at that hour. The old soldier said that in that case they would have to take their meal outside.

The couple returned shortly before 8 o'clock last night and went to room No. 10. Grabowski went downstairs at 9:30 o'clock, according to Clerk Joseph Fenwal. He did not appear to be at all disturbed and stood about the lobby for a few minutes, then sauntered slowly out on the avenue.

The home closes at 10 o'clock at night and Grabowski did not return. The crime was discovered this morning when a maid went to make up the room. The girl ran screaming into the hall, and it was a few minutes before she could tell of what she had seen.

In the old man's coat was a bank book showing a balance of \$818.90 in the Fort Dodge Savings Bank. No money was found in the clothing. Detective Markey obtained a good description of the missing Grabowski and is eager to locate him.

TANGO THEF PLEADS GUILTY.

Eaton Arraigned Only on Charge of Kohn Theft.

Herbert J. Eaton of No. 610 West One Hundred and Seventy-eighth street, the "Tango Thief," pleaded guilty before Judge Mulqueen in General Sessions today to an indictment charging grand larceny in the first degree. He will be sentenced Friday.

Although there are two charges against Eaton, he pleaded guilty to but one—the theft of \$18,000 worth of jewelry from a Miss Kohn of the Calvert Hotel, Sheepshead Bay, whom he met in a restaurant in this city. Eaton was arrested Sept. 30 on the charge of robbing the apartment of Mrs. Arthur E. Pike at No. 440 Riverside Drive. He had met Mrs. Pike in the Hotel Astor. When trying to escape Eaton was shot.

Watson, Missing Yehosh Man, Found in Newark.

William H. Watson, President of the Colonial Coal Company, who disappeared a week ago from his home in Yonkers, has been found in Newark, where he was found while suffering from amnesia. He was taken to the Grand Jury which indicted Henry C. Merritt, James A. Eitan and Charles F. Brookes are yet to appear.

WORKED WITH DUCHESS.

Returning Nurse Says Austrian Denied Russian Atrocities.

On the Fabre liner Venezia, arriving today from Marseille, was Mrs. Kristin von Mereska, who has been in Red Cross work at Budapest. Mrs. Mereska says she worked side by side with the Duchess of Anhalt, and that many of the Austrian wounded returning from the engagements with the Russians passed through their hands.

"According to these men," she said, "there is no truth in the stories of Russian atrocities. The Russians treated our men with consideration and looked after the Austrian wounded with the same care as they did their own."

T. De Witt Cuyler Pleads Not Guilty. T. De Witt Cuyler of Philadelphia, the nineteenth of the twenty-one indicted directors and former directors in the New Haven case to appear, came before Judge Foster in the United States District Court, today, and pleaded not guilty. The same course pursued in the cases of those who had already pleaded, was followed. Cuyler being released in \$5,000 bail. James A. Eitan and Charles F. Brookes are yet to appear.
