WOMAN IN NIGHTIE PUTS UP HOT FIGHT AND NABS BURGLAR

Risks Her Life in Struggle on Fire Escape and Earns Praise.

"If there were more such women as you there would be less crime in this city," said Magistrate Nash on the bench of the Manhattan Avenue Court, Williamsburg, to-day, addressing Mrs. Theodora Markowitz, who stood blushing and disconcerted under his praise.

Mrs. Markowitz had merited the Magistrate's commendation by fighting a burglar, single handed and in her nightclothes, from the fourth floor platform of a fire escape to the first floor grating, when each minute she was in danger of being killed. Robert Logan, the husky burglar, who said he had no home, but who has plenty of

muscle, grinned sheepishly as the story was told.

Theodore Markowitz and his wife live on the fourth floor, rear, of the tenement at No. 422 Rodney Street. At 4 o'clock this morning Markowitz was disturbed by the overturning of a chair in his room. He leaped from bed and grappled with the intruder, hurled him back just as Mrs. Markowitz ran to the rescue. Markowitz evidently thought it better to leave the burglar to the mercy of his better half while he ran for assistance.

Out onto the fire escape platform they went. The burglar hit her in the face, but she was in hot pursuit and caught him only to have him wriggle loose again. He was just dropping to the ground when Policeman McCoville of the Bedford Avenue Station ran through an arseway and nabbed him.

ADMITS KILLING MAN IN FIGHT IN QUARRY

Frank Grezetta, However, Says He Slew Yovo Miquili in Self-Defense.

Frank Grezetta, a laborer of No. 455 West Forty-second street, was arraigned in West Side Police Court to-day charged with the murder of Yovo Miquili, in the Empire Limestone Quarry at Sanborn, N. Y., Nov. 3.

The prisoner admitted killing Miquili and was held without bail to await the arrival of the sheriff from Sanborn. Grezetta fled after she murder and the Sanborn authorities arrested, on suspicion, Louis Magas. This man has a brother, Samuel, who lives at No. 431 West Fortieth Street, Louis

wrote to Samuel, telling him that Grezetta had committed the crime. Samuel communicated with the police and the arrest of Grezetta, who had come to New York, followed. Grezetta says he killed Miquili in self-defense after Miquili attacked him with an iron bar.

THIEVES TAKE AWAY WAGON LOAD OF BOOZE

Police Are Puzzled by Daring of Band That Robbed McAvoy's Store.

The police to-day scoured the neighborhood of East Forty-third street, between Second and Third Avenues, for a band of thieves who broke into the wholesale whiskey store of James H. McAvoy and carted off a wagon load of goods. Mr. McAvoy closed his store at 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon. When he returned at 10 o'clock yesterday morning the place was a wreck. His private papers were strewn about the floor and whiskey bottle coverings were scattered everywhere. Three ten-gallon kegs and twenty-four cases of old rye and sixty-four bottles full of rye which had been just labeled were gone. Mr. McAvoy's alligator-skin suitcase, with some clothing and haberdashery, were also gone.

It is believed a wagon was backed up to the front door and the goods loaded on it. Evidently the thieves got in at the back door and slipped their way to the front. On every door and drawer were the marks of the jimmy. The thieves pried everything open which had been left closed. Several burglaries have been committed in stores in the neighborhood recently. Around the corner on Second Avenue Mrs. Theresa Farlane, a milliner, was set upon by a gang of toughs Sunday afternoon. She was bound and gagged and the place ransacked.

Falling Into Infidelity In the Evil Day.

The Blind Lead the Blind—180,000 Preachers Fallen—Others in Danger—Laity Also in Danger—What Must Be Done—The Apostles' Warning and Prophecy.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., November 15.—Pastor Russell's text to-day was "The whole armor of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."—Ephesians 6:13.

All the Apostles pointed forward to our day—the conclusion of the present Age and the inauguration of the New Kingdom. With one voice they all tell us that this Age is the one in which will be put on in Satan "the prince of this world," prevails, and in which the Lord's Cause and His people are more or less set at naught. They all tell us that the inauguration of Messiah's Kingdom signifies a momentous change in respect to these matters. "In His day the righteous shall flourish and the evil-doers shall be cut off." God wisely and kindly veiled their eyes in respect to the length of time before the Reign of Righteousness would begin. Hence the Apostles all speak of the New Dispensation as imminent—not, however, declaring it to be expected in this day; rather, they expected to fall asleep in death, but with the assurance that with the dawning of the New Dispensation they would share in "His Resurrection"—Christ's resurrection—the resurrection to glory, honor and immortality on the spirit plane.

Our text is one of these prophecies respecting the future—predicting the inauguration of Messiah's Kingdom. Like all other Scriptures bearing on this subject, it implies that the transition from the Reign of Sin to the Reign of Righteousness, from the dominion of Satan to the Dominion of Christ, is a great time of trouble, because Satan and his deluded subjects will not quickly and meekly renounce their claims to earthly dominion and submit themselves loyally to the King of kings and the Lord of lords. This will necessitate the breaking in pieces of these systems—their subjugation.

As we have already pointed out, this breaking and shaking and trouble are coming from every quarter and are described in the Scriptures as a great whirlwind raised up from every quarter of the earth. Other Scriptures have told us about the trouble upon the earth, rather, to us the coming of war, to be followed by the earthquake of Socialism, and that to be followed by the fire of anarchy. Still other Scriptures have shown us the conflict between the people in general and the princes of the world—merchant princes, manufacturing princes, religious and political princes and kings—showing us that eventually there will be two great divisions in the conflict, and that the whole earth will be terribly devastated by the ensuing anarchy.

"The Evil Day" Upon Religionists. Our text refers to the present time as an evil day upon religious people—a day of trial, of danger, of victory for the few, of disaster for the many professing the name of Christ. It may surprise some when we assert that we, the Church, have already been in this evil day referred to in our text for some years, and that it still continues and will merge into the evil day upon the world. This means that the evil day upon the Church began before the evil day upon the nations. This is in full accord with the Scriptures which declare in judgment of those who are "of God"—the Church—I Pet. 4:17.

For nearly forty years the Church has been undergoing severe trials and testings along the very lines indicated by the Apostle in our text, and in various other descriptions of this time furnished us in the New Testament. During this period Theology, Higher Criticism, Evolutionism and various other confusing teachings have come forward. Each contains fragments of truth and masses of error. From the Scriptural standpoint they are brought forward at the present time by the Adversary, Satan, with a view to confusing the people and leading them away from the Truth.

Satan is represented as being especially active at this time, for the reason that this is the time when special light upon the Divine Character and Plan are due to come to the Church. Seeing that the people are awakening to more intelligent thought on religious subjects, the Adversary brings forth a host of philosophies to entangle, to mislead, putting darkness in the guise of light, and endeavoring to make the light of the dawning New Day appear as darkness. This the Apostle refers to in the context (v. 18): "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this Age, and against wicked spirits in high positions. The wicked spirits, we understand the Scriptures to teach, are the fallen angels, called demons throughout the New Testament. Under the captaincy of Satan they have not ceased their warfare against the Lamb and those who follow Him, nor will they cease until in the due time, Immanuel shall bind that old Serpent and restrain all his evil influences, to the intent that the world may be no longer deceived.—Revelation 20:1-8.

During this evil day the truthfulness of the Apostle's word will be quickly put to the test. The people of God will be able to withstand these seductive and evil influences. Only thus guided with the Truth, protected with the breastplate of righteousness, and with the preparation of the Gospel of Peace, armed with the shield of faith and intellectually with the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God—only these have been able to stand, and to help others to stand, in a time when thousands have been falling into errors, into unbelief—some being turned aside from the simplicity of the Gospel Message of the Resurrection through the death
