

DEMAND STREET BE CUT WHERE TWO GIRLS DIED

Long Island Workers Who
Have to Walk on Tracks
Plan Mass Meeting.

The residents of the Laurel Hill neighborhood, Long Island City, are arranging for a mass meeting in Wagner's Hall, at the head of Hobson Avenue, to demand the cutting through of a street along Newtown Creek parallel with the tracks of the Long Island Railroad.

The death of two girls and the fatal injury of another one yesterday on the tracks, which are now the only route to and from the factories along the creek, brought to a head the indignation of taxpayers who were assessed back in the days before consolidation for the cutting through of such a street. The plans were drawn and approved under the Bernal administration, but never carried out.

There was widespread wrath and grief to-day among the factory workers and the Greenpoint neighbors of Millicent Brannigan of No. 30 Van Dam Street and Fannie Bergstrom of No. 332 Nassau Street, the latest victims of the dangerous conditions. Mabel Rankin of No. 77 Driggs Avenue, who was with them, will be crippled for life if she recovers. She is in St. John's Hospital with a fractured skull, a broken hip and other injuries.

There is no other way for thousands of workers in the great factories along Newtown Creek to reach their Greenpoint homes than the highway of the railroad tracks.

The three girls who were struck last night were all under seventeen. They had been schoolmates and were employed in the same department by the National Enamelling and Stamping Company. They left the factory at a little after 5.30, starting up the track after most of their fellow employees had preceded them. They were walking against the stiff wind with their arms clasping each other's waist.

The fast freight, speeding down the grade toward Long Island City, was hidden from them by the high factory fences along the track and George Waters, the engineer, did not see them until they were struck.


