## "THE TIGER" DEAD AND "LITTLE ITALY" BREATHES EASIER

Wife and Son See Alleged Black Hand Leader Shot Down.

Fiumano, "the Tiger," is dead at last, bored through the body by nine steel-jacketed bullets, and all of Brooklyn's "Little Italy" about the vicinity of Union Street breathes easier to-day.

Three times before men have tried to kill Fiumano—twice with shotguns at close range and once with a revolver, but he seemed to live a charmed life. People said as long as Fiumano lived trouble would be abroad and men would continue to die violent deaths.

Fiumano, whose given name was Francesco, but who was known only as "the Tiger," was shot down in front of his grocery store at No. 50 Union Street, Brooklyn, late yesterday afternoon while many looked on.

The murderer used an automatic and emptied nine shells in the chamber into "the Tiger's" body to make sure to get him. Fiumano's wife and his son, Vincenzo, who is just back from the House of Correction, witnessed the deed, but when questioned by the detectives they "knew nothing."

Since Fiumano was popularly believed to have been a henchman of Cincotta, the Black Hander who tried to bleed Caruso and who came to his death in a similar manner a week ago, those who speak—and they talk in whispers—say that the same people who "got" Cincotta finished off the score of vengeance with "the Tiger" yesterday.

"The Tiger" was a power in the shifty circles of illegitimate business

among the Italians of Brooklyn. He is credited with having been the financial secretary of Cincotta's Black Hand group, keeping tabs on the wealth of this and that person and recommending those with money for the tender business of the "blackmailers." About his head, as about that of Cincotta, grisly stories of betrayal, reprisals and murders had long centered.

Some time in 1910 somebody shot "the Tiger" through the hip with a revolver but did not kill him. Then in March, 1911, somebody fired both barrels of a shotgun at him at Union and Hamilton Streets, puncturing his hips with lead slugs but not removing him by a good deal. Just a year later Giovanni Mangharita tried the shotgun on "the Tiger" again and got twenty years in Sing Sing for his pains.

On Feb. 12, 1913, Antonio Romeo was shot and killed and "the Tiger" was arrested. But the Grand Jury failed to find an indictment for murder against him. Last November Paul Pensabena and P. Chiliberto were shot in front of "the Tiger's" store. Suspicion was all that attached to Fiumano then.

As the result of this shooting Frank Stallo and Giuseppe Pensabena, a nephew of the man who had been shot, met in the street and fought a duel with revolvers. Both died.

Italian detectives of Brooklyn Headquarters to-day arrested Paul Pensabena, who was mysteriously shot in front of Fiumano's store last November, and his nephew, Bruno Pensabena.

At their home, No. 23 Union Street, the detectives found a veritable arsenal, comprising two shotguns, several daggers and a spring cane which shoots a steel ball through its length as a rifle barrel projects a bullet. They were held on the charge of possessing dangerous weapons.
