PARIS, March 12.—Gen. Joffre, the French commander, has sent a letter to Mrs. Clara Washington Lopp of New York thanking her heartily for the large supply of tobacco she gathered for distribution among the French soldiers. Most of the supply was obtained in New York. Gen. Joffre's letter follows:

"I hasten to thank you heartily and sincerely for the magnificent gift you sent on behalf of generous friends in America to my brave soldiers. I am deeply touched to see your great country taking an interest in them: They deserve all the gifts which are made them because of the courage, energy and unalterable good humor they bring to the defense of a noble cause. You have helped to give them a little joy. Once again their chief thanks you with all his heart."

### \$250,000 CAMPAIGN FOR NEWSBOYS' HOME CLUB IS MAPPED OUT

Executive Committee Lays Out Subscription Work for Fifty Ten-Men Teams.

Confidence marked the first meeting of the Campaign Executive Committee of the Newsboys' Home Club yesterday in Delmonico's downtown restaurant when fifty men gathered to formulate plans for their campaign to raise \$250,000 for the new site and building of the club.

After luncheon was served William Sullivan, Jr. was elected temporary chairman and E. M. Sobels, temporary secretary.

Wilbur A. Bowen outlined the method of obtaining subscriptions. There is to be a business committee, empowered to act when the executive committee is not convened. The work will be intrusted to fifty teams of ten men each. Every team is to report daily and get names of persons upon whom to call. No one is to be permitted to solicit subscriptions without having received an assignment card from the committee. Subscriptions may be paid in instalments.

Jason Rogers said he was certain it not only would be easy to raise the desired amount for so worthy a cause, but there would be lots of fun in the work. He said the club has grown to be a power in directing the boys of the streets "toward the light."

Major S. Wood McClave said he thought it would be the easiest thing in the world to raise the money for so good a cause. S. M. Bard of the committee said Mayor Mitchell had written to him, "Put me down," and that George W. Perkins had said, "Yes, I'll go on and I'll do something too."

W. F. McCombs, T. H. Watkins, Ralph Pullitzer, L. M. D. McGuire, I. T. Bush, Frank Guider, H. J. Cochran and J. W. Meads were elected to the committee of organizers.
