

**MAY'S WINTRY SPELL
RUINS UP-STATE CROPS,
ICE IN SOME PLACES**

Damage to Garden Truck Estimated at Over \$500,000—
Mercury Down to 29.

ALBANY, May 21.—Reports from all sections of the State to-day show that a killing frost was general last night and thousands of dollars' damage done to crops. Ice formed at some places and the ground was frozen hard. The temperature dropped to 29.

In Niagara and Orleans Counties severe damage was done to the strawberry crop and upward of five million tomato plants were also affected. The damage at those points is estimated at \$500,000.

In Orange and Sullivan Counties ice of a considerable thickness formed, and in the Adirondacks small lakes were frozen in places. The fruit crops, being somewhat advanced, mostly escaped the blight.

**\$40,000 JEWEL THEFT
BLOCKED BY POLICE**

Four Men Are Accused of Trying to Break Safe in Loft Building.

After a lively fight in the fifth floor loft at No. 40 West Twenty-eighth Street last night, the police arrested Bernardo Monteforte, a dry goods merchant, No. 318 Jefferson Street, Hoboken; James Sappo, a painter, No. 420 Adams Street, Hoboken; Vincenzo Amano, a clerk, No. 320 Broome Street, Manhattan, and Antonio Nariso, clerk, No. 452 Atlantic Avenue, Brooklyn, all of whom were charged with attempting to rob Morris Sappo, diamond merchant, of the \$40,000 worth of uncut diamonds in his safe. The four men were said to be working on the safe when the detectives descended upon them.

Detectives Tait and Moore of the Second Branch Bureau, had been investigating a series of burglaries in that district, and the other day they noticed Amano and Nariso going about the loft buildings, soliciting waste paper. They were trailed.

Yesterday afternoon Sappo left some bags at the loft buildings, and at 6 o'clock last night all four men went inside. The detectives watched with night glasses from a loft across the street, and when they saw a faint glare on the fifth floor they rushed over and caught the intruders.

King of Central Park Arrested.
John Heyward, alias Miller, alias Burns, known as "The King of Central Park," since he sold a Long Island farmer an option on some "choice building lots" there last July, for which he served ten months, was again arrested last night. Detectives Casazza and Muggs of the Central Office say Heyward had just taken \$10 away from Arthur W. Hawley of Richmond, Va., in a coin matching game at Fifty-seventh Street and Fifth Avenue when they arrested him. Mayorstrate Brown in Yorkville Court held him in bail of \$500 for examination.
