

BRIDE SETS TRAP FOR OLD ADMIRER AS BLACKMAILER

Pretty Mrs. Stern, Threatened With "Stories," Told Husband About It.

HE CALLS IN POLICE.

Burgauer Caught After Chase in Riverside Park by Watching Detectives.

A young woman sitting on a bench at Riverside Drive and One Hundred and Thirtieth Street at midnight with a stylishly dressed youth suddenly pressed a handkerchief to her face. Two detectives jumped from a shadow at the signal and ran toward the girl's companion.

The youth took to his heels, with Detectives Brangato and Gompers in close pursuit. One seized him by the collar, but he slipped out of his coat and continued to One Hundred and Fourteenth Street, where a threat from Gompers to shoot brought him to a halt. The detectives say he blubbered and wailed so loudly that scores of Riverside Drive apartment windows were raised by persons who had been awakened.

The prisoner described himself as

Elwood Burgauer, twenty-one, of No. 505 West One Hundred and Thirtieth Street. The City Directory gives the name of Morris Burgauer as living at that address and being Treasurer of the Royal Embroidery Works at No. 149 Broadway. The youth was looked up at Police Headquarters on a charge of attempted extortion on complaint of Mrs. Adèle Stern of No. 118 West One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Street, a pretty brunette bride of three months.

It was Mrs. Stern who gave the handkerchief signal to the detectives on an indication that Burgauer had accepted \$45 in marked money from her. The detectives say he threw away the bills as he tried to escape, but they found them in the grass.

Mrs. Stern comes from a prominent mining family of Colorado. According to her story, she met Burgauer last summer at Edgemore, L. I., and they became friends. Afterward she met Julius Stern, who is connected with a wholesale meat concern, and three months ago married him. Three weeks ago, she said, she met Burgauer and he threatened to tell stories on her to her husband unless she gave him \$10 a week. She refused and he offered then to accept \$5. She refused again, but later gave him \$10 he said he urgently needed.

Yesterday he called up her home on the telephone. She refused to talk to him, and later says she decided to tell her husband all about it. Stern arranged to meet Burgauer last night with the marked money. The police say the first words he spoke on walking up to Mrs. Stern were, "Well, have you got the money?"

Before being looked up Burgauer asked that a certain number be called up and the information given that he "was spending the night with friends." He also asked that he be provided with a blanket and that his lawyer be notified.

Mrs. Stern, who was with her hus-

band at the home of his father, at No. 547 Riverside Drive, declined to make any statement early to-day, saying her story would come out in court. While she gave her address as No. 618 West One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Street, the couple have not finished moving into the apartment.

Morris Burgauer said over the telephone he had never heard his son speak of Mrs. Stern and was astonished over his arrest.
