

**MONKEY HOUSE WASHER GETS "ONLY" 30 DAYS**

**Magistrate Koenig Dances Pleaders for Mercy in Case of "Hard-working" Prisoner.**

Edward Senick, thirty-eight, of No. 51 East Fifty-fourth Street, was arrested on Sunday at the monkey house in Central Park. Detective O'Callaghan said he had seen Senick whispering to young girls and taking hold of their arms. In the Night Court Sunday Magistrate Koenig held Senick for examination.

Last night when the accused man appeared his wife and four neighbors came to tell the Magistrate that Senick was honest, hardworking and above the charge made against him.

"I have two witnesses—young girls," said O'Callaghan. "They do not wish to appear in Court, but they will back up my story."

"I believe the story of the officer," said the Magistrate, "but since Senick is hardworking, I will be lenient in his case and give him only thirty days in the workhouse."

The prisoner almost collapsed at the "leniency." He was the forty-first man arrested in the monkey house since about July 1, and every one of the nature lovers has received a workhouse sentence ranging from ten days to three months.

**NO. 7—A HOME-MADE "CHEST EXPANDER."**

To-day I am giving you exercises to be taken with a chest expander, which I made at home with two package handles and three-quarters of a yard of elastic, which is sewed securely to the handles. The entire outfit cost me but 5 cents. Many of my readers have probably seen the regulation chest expanders, which consist of two handles and a very heavy spring. These exercisers make an ideal addition to any gymnasium and are a diversion from the dumbbells and wands. The home-made one, illustrated and described here, will answer every purpose of the regulation heavy spring expander, which I personally found almost too heavy and stiff to handle with ease. I have been told that lighter weight ones may be bought and are made for women and children exclusively.

Many varieties of beneficial exercises may be practiced each day with the chest expander, and its uses are by no means confined to the improvement of the upper part of the body, as its name indicates.

Body bending, swaying, twisting and many other good exercises may be taken with the elastic expander. When I use the term chest expander it does not necessarily mean that the use of this little one will add many inches to your chest and shoulders. I am asked the question in my correspondence every day: "Why do you recommend chest raising for developing, when I have been doing this strenuous exercise for the arms and shoulders in hopes of getting rid of the superfluous flesh on them?" and it is just this very point that I have tried so hard to make plain to my readers in the past articles. Once again I will explain that nature intended each of us to attain a certain condition of perfection and if we do not live up to this, and go through life burdened with pounds of excess flesh, it is our own fault.

**ALL ROUND DEVELOPMENT NEEDED BY ALL.**

The ONLY way to develop muscle flesh, which takes the place of the soft unhealthy adipose tissue, is by strenuous exercise, which increases the blood supply on which the muscles feed. This same condition is true also of the under-developed body. From observation and experience I know that it is the natural tendency of the human body, if not abused by wrong living, to take its normal shape, and this very reason, advise an all round development of the whole muscular system, for my about as well as my slender followers.

This is best attained by the various exercises which I am describing and illustrating for you in the lessons each day, and all of which are beneficial in attaining the state of perfection and equilibrium which spells health and attractive personality.

Do not, therefore, regret having mastered an exercise for chest development (as one of my readers has) if you have been practicing it to reduce the fat from the shoulder blades, for in doing so you have caused friction in the fatty deposit, which is the only real way to remove it. I have repeated this explanation in hopes of making this ever-puzzling question clear to my readers.

To-morrow I will explain and illustrate the manner in which an ordinary transom may be utilized for "chinning the bar" exercises.

MARY S. (Dallas, Texas) writes: "What exercise will strengthen the spine?"

Trunk raising, body bending and body twisting. Rowing is a very fine exercise for the spine also.

E. P. writes: "I am seventeen and still undeveloped. What shall I do?"

Practice all of the exercises and also the deep breathing ones. Live in the open and get plenty of sleep. It is a very easy matter to develop the entire body at your age.

E. L. asks: "Will you please publish something for a very oily skin?"

Excessively oily complexion is usually accompanied by coarse pores and blackheads. It is the result of poor circulation. Do not use any cold creams on the oily skin, but bathe the face at night with the complexion brush and hot water with a good pure soap. Finish, after washing out all traces of the soap, with cold water to close the pores. Apply an astringent to harden the skin made soft by the hot water. Do not eat greasy foods or pastries.

C. G. C. asks: "What exercises will strengthen the stomach, as I am greatly troubled with stomach trouble and indigestion?"

Trunk raising, trunk twisting and body bending will help you.

**CHINA TO STAY REPUBLIC BUT KEEP ONE PRESIDENT**

Tentative Decision Reported Reached to Make Chief Executive's Post Hereditary.

PEKING, Sept. 7.—To obviate the necessity of again obtaining the recognition of foreign nations, the Government has decided tentatively to maintain the form of a republic instead of restoring a monarchy, but to make the Presidency permanent and hereditary, according to information obtained in high official quarters. Gen. Li Yuan-liang, who was reported to have resigned the vice presidency on Sept. 5, presided today at a session of the Advisory Council and the newspapers have been authorized to announce a reconciliation of his views with those of President Yuan Shai-Kai.

**BABY BORN TO KAISER'S DAUGHTER-IN-LAW DIES**

Princess Adalbert, Wife of Emperor's Third Son, Loses Child Soon After Birth.

LONDON, Sept. 7.—Princess Adalbert, wife of the third son of the German Emperor, gave birth to a daughter Saturday. The child died soon after its birth. The condition of the Princess is reported to be satisfactory.

Princess Adalbert and Princess Adelaide of Saxe-Meiningen were married Aug. 26, 1914. Less than a month later the Prince was reported to have been killed in battle at Arras, but the rumor proved to have no foundation. In March of this year he was promoted to the rank of captain in the navy and major in the army.

**LYNCHERS STORM JAIL, BUT SLAYER OF THREE ESCAPES**

Granco Rushed to Baltimore as 125 Men in Autos Reach Salisbury

CAMBRIDGE, Md., Sept. 7.—Frank Granco, accused of murdering three persons near Snow Hill, was brought here early this morning and placed aboard the State steamer Governor Thomas, bound for Baltimore to escape mob vengeance.

Shortly after midnight 125 men from Snow Hill arrived at the Salisbury jail, where Granco had spent a few hours after having been removed from the Snow Hill jail yesterday afternoon. One of the party had a coil of rope. Jail officials showed a committee through the jail to convince them the prisoner was not there.

The Snow Hill party, some of whom were masked, re-entered automobiles and resumed the chase.

The masked mobsters shot and killed Lewis F. Robinson, his wife, and Alvin Granco, a helper on Justice's farm. Granco said he intended to end his life also, but lost his nerve and surrendered to the police.

Granco killed Mrs. Robinson as she stood in the hallway of her home, trying to pacify the lynch mob, who it is said, acted like a mobster. After sending a bullet into the woman's temple he ran to the road and killed the woman's husband as he was coming to her aid. Granco fired at him, killing him instantly.

In subsequent statements Granco said he became jealous when he found that Robinson had stolen the affections of Mrs. Robinson, whom Granco said, he loved himself.

**25,499 TRAINED TO FIGHT.**

Census Figures Show New York Total, Including "Regulars."

ALBANY, N. Y., Sept. 7.—There was a total of 25,499 men in New York State who had had military training on June 1st, according to census figures announced by Secretary of State Francis M.Hughes of this number 17,000 were members of the National Guard, 7,500 were in the United States army and stationed at New York forts, while 1,500 were members of the New York Naval militia. According to Secretary Hughes the number of men now in the National Guard is only about 600 more than were enrolled in 1913.

**PATCH BABIES' SPINES TO CURE RARE DISEASE**

Polyclinic Surgeons Strengthen Tissue at Spot Where Spinal Cord is Unprotected.

A new operation for a rare infantile deformity is being used at Polyclinic Hospital for the first time in the history of neurological surgery, it was said yesterday. It is for the removal of "spina bifida," an abnormality of the spinal cord of babies.

To be successful the operation must be made soon after birth. Five days is considered a favorable length of time to wait. Three babies which have been under the care of Dr. William Sharpe at Polyclinic within the last week are respectively three weeks, four weeks and one month old.

Unless an operation is made very shortly after the birth of a child afflicted with "spina bifida," paralysis of the lower part of the body and complete arresting of development results. Death is certain to follow shortly with the breaking of the spinal cord at the exposed spot.

Two of the babies that have been operated upon will be discharged from the hospital within a few days.


