

JAY B. LIPPINCOTT'S SECOND WEDDING IS SURPRISE TO SOCIETY

Much Secrecy Enshrouds Wealthy Philadelphia Divorcee's Re-Marriage.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 15.—Jay B. Lippincott, wealthy, one-time champion polo player and member of many clubs, has married for the second time. The ceremony was performed in New York City, and his bride was Mrs. Ludlow Huntington of Flushing, L. I.

A member of the Lippincott family, famous as the founders of the publishing house of that name, to-day confirmed the reports of the wedding, but declined to say how Mr. Lippincott and Mrs. Huntington met or anything of the antecedents of the bride.

Lippincott was first married to Miss Camilla Hare of Washington, D. C. They were divorced in 1910, Mrs. Lippincott being awarded a divorce at Colorado Springs in 1910 on the ground of incompatibility.

They have two daughters, Miss Camilla and Miss Priscilla A. Lippincott, the elder of whom is expected to make her debut this season.

When asked about Mr. Lippincott's second marriage to-day, Mrs. William P. O'Neill, his cousin, said that the immediate family was present at the wedding celebration. She said that Mrs. Huntington was of a New York family, but was not well known to Philadelphia society.

Mr. Lippincott is a member of the Huttenhouse, Racine, Radnor Hunt, Country, St. Anthony and Huntington Valley Country Clubs. He was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1902.

He is a son of the late Craig Lippincott and a brother of Mrs. Samuel K. Reeves of "Craige-E" at Meadowbrook, Pa., and Mrs. Douglas Francho.


