Original Home Dressmaking Designs
 By The Evening World's Fashion Expert

Frocks and Suits for Wear All the Day Long Must Be Specially Designed and Are of Green and Red Broadcloth and Are Trimmed With Fur That Matches.

 American women have a distinct way of dressing all their own, and a very comfortable way too. They talk a lot about formal and correct daytime apparel, but nine out of ten women cherish the one-piece frock or suit which they can put on in the morning, wear to luncheon downtown and in the afternoon be presentable for a social occasion. A frock capable of such varied usage is, needless to



say, no ordinary frock. Though it may be simple, it demands special planning in every way—in style, material, trimming, &c.
 This winter a great deal of broadcloth will be worn, the new kind being soft and as flexible as silk. Serge is particularly adapted to one-piece frocks, because the only kind fashionable is the light-weight fine twill, which is not desirable for suits or coats. The coarser weaves are entirely out of date.
 As for colors, dark blue is ubiquitous both for suits and frocks, but this winter both dark green and dark red will share favor with it. Various names are given these last mentioned colors, including hunters' green, Lin-

coln, Robin Hood green, and for red, Burgundy and Bordeaux. Garibaldi green is by far the most economical color for a practical frock, for it is inconspicuous and can be worn often without attracting undue attention. But red has quite the opposite effect and should be indulged only by those who can have many clothes.
 Fur is one of the most delightful trimmings for daytime frocks, and it is used so much one almost wonders where it all comes from. Astrachan, squirrel, skunk, beaver and seal are cut in bands to lend a rich finish to a skirt, a collar and cuffs to a coat, or a belt or collar to a dress.

DESCRIPTION OF THE DESIGN.

A satisfactory bit of fur is used in the design I am showing to-day for a practical frock such as I have mentioned. The model at the right suggests the effect of a narrow band of fur, chosen to emphasize a charming little shoulder cape of velvet. If the frock were of dark-green broadcloth the velvet to match would contrast prettily with either astrachan or beaver. At the neck a very high collar of net is partially wired, and in front a deep-plaited frill of the same drops as a dainty relief over the plain bodice. With restrained elaboration a belt of silver brocade ribbon or one of velvet embroidered in Greek design with silver threads, points upward in back to allow a double cording at the top of the skirt to make itself known.
 This is an appreciated part of the skirt, inasmuch as it is otherwise plainly gathered and trimmed simply with a band of velvet. This is placed, however, at a conspicuous distance from the bottom, which aids in the distinction of the whole frock. As plaid velveteens are being shown, I have suggested at the left a use for it in this design. A shoulder cape of it, which parts away over the shoulders, is caught under a belt of fur, which also edges it.
 Fall silk matching the main color in the plaid may be used for the main waist portion, including the long sleeves, while a band of the silk through the skirt breaks the monotony of the plaid. This would make a pleasing afternoon frock, but not as serviceable as the one first described.

CHARLTON IN COLLAPSE ON EVE OF MURDER TRIAL
 American Suffers Shock Owing to Withdrawal of His Chief Counsel From Case.

COMB. Italy, Oct. 4.—Porter Charlton, under a doctor's care to-day on the eve of his trial for the murder of his wife, Mary Scott Charlton, in their villa on the shore of Lake Como. The news that his chief counsel, Giuseppe, had suddenly withdrawn from the case was a shock to the young American, and his nervous condition is such that physicians have not permitted his remaining lawyer, Cattaneo, to visit his cell.
 The court room to-day was just in readiness. Several extra juries were drawn in, facing the iron cage in which Charlton will sit throughout the trial guarded by carabini. A big throng of spectators is expected. Legal experts give Charlton two chances out of three for acquittal on the ground that he was insane when he saw his wife with a pistol. Both Prosecutor Melloni and Charlton's attorneys believe the trial will last about five days.
