

NAVAL STRENGTH OF NATION UNDER NEW DEFENSE PLAN

Experts Give Figures to Show What Growth Will Be in Ten Years.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—What the United States navy will be in 1925 if the Administration's defense programme is approved by Congress, was described by naval experts. The strength of the navy will be 100 battleships of the first line, twenty-seven. These ships would all carry more than eight big guns each; most of them twelve 14-inch fifty calibre rifles, the new weapon recently developed by the Ordnance Bureau and believed to be the equal or superior of any navy gun now afloat. With two exceptions they would all be able to steam more than twenty knots an hour.

Battleships of the second line, fourteen. These ships all carry heavy guns each and some of them have a speed of nearly twenty knots. Reserve battleships, nine. These ships are all now in commission or in reserve. Three older ships, the Oregon, Massachusetts and Indiana, will have gone to the scrap heap within two or three years. Battle cruisers, six. They will mount eight 14-inch fifty calibre rifles and have a speed of 35 knots an hour.

Scout cruisers, thirteen. This includes the Salem, Chester and Birmingham, the only scouting ships now in the navy. Destroyers, ninety-six. This figure allows for the retirement of sixteen destroyers built before 1908 and does not take into account nineteen torpedo boats, many of which are still in service.

Fleet submarines, eighteen. The Schley, first vessel of this type designed for any navy, will be launched in a few months. She will make twenty knots on the surface, while the others will make twenty-five or more.

Coast defense submarines, 149. This figure all submarines of this type now being built and allows for the retirement of nine boats of the A and D classes which are now doing duty in the Philippines and at Panama and giving satisfactory service, despite the fact that they are twelve years old. Navy officers believe most of them will still be available for harbor defense in eight years.

Gunboats, thirty-one. These vessels are for river and shallow harbor use. The new programme will add only two vessels of this type. In addition to the foregoing there are ten armored cruisers, five protected cruisers, four first class cruisers, twelve second class cruisers and nine coast defense monitors available for reserve fleet duty. It is not planned to build any more ships of these types.

For the task planned for navy designers by the new programme it is probable that considerable additions to the civil employees in the departmental bureaus will be necessary. The bureau of construction and repair, which will draw plans for the new ships, has a staff of 1,000. It is since the weight of every rivet or bolt that goes into a 32,000 ton battleship must be calculated in order that she may be in proper balance, submerged to the proper depth and have the desired displacement. The department prides itself on the fact that in twelve years has been over-weight, a record unequalled by any foreign navy.

DETECTIVES SEARCH FOR ROBBERS WHO HELD UP ERIE TRAIN

Five Young Bandits, One a Boy, Who Engaged in Pistol Battle.

A force of 100 detectives under Lieut. Kelleher are hunting to-day for the five young bandits—one of them a boy—who held up the Erie "Silk Express" at Glen Rock, Bergen County, at 10.30 o'clock last night and were routed by the armed trainmen after a pistol battle. The boy escaped in an automobile and the others were lost in the fog and are believed to have made their way to this city.

Lieut. Kelleher says the robbers were New York gangsters, who have been opening cases and throwing valuable packages out along the right of way, to be picked up and carried off by confederates. They tried a new scheme last night, stopping the train at a point where an automobile was in waiting, but the trainmen and detectives riding on the train moved so fast that the robbers were unable to complete the job.
