ITALIANS CLAIM BIG GAINS, BERLIN REPORTS SUCCESS OF AUSTRIANS ON WHOLE LINE

General Attack From the Swiss Fifty-Hour Bombardment Preceded Attack, Say the Udine Report. HEAVY ITALIAN LOSS. WAR IN SECOND PHASE. Losses by Italy Placed at 45,000; Loss by Foe Estimated at 100,000.

UDINE, Italy, Oct. 23 (Via Paris).—The Italian army is making a general attack along the whole line from Switzerland to the Adriatic.

In the opinion of the Italian General Staff, this has been accomplished, and the war is now entering its second phase.

It is estimated here that the Italians have taken 25,000 prisoners during the war and have put out of action upward of 100,000 men in all.

TEUTON INVADERS FORCE A CROSSING OF DRINA RIVER

Press on From the Danube to Points 35 Miles From Serbian Border. BULGARS MAKE GAINS. 40,000 French Troops Aid the Serbs in Fortifying Town of Koprlik.

BERLIN (via London), Oct. 23.—Rapid Teutonic advances in Serbia were announced in a War Office report issued here this afternoon.

Instead of remaining stuck fast along a line twelve or fifteen miles south of the Danube, the German and Austrian forces were said to be operating in places some thirty-five miles south of the stream, with the Serbs retreating before them.

"We have stormed and taken the Serbian positions between Lukavivo and Kosmaj (23 miles almost due south of Belgrade)."

GERMAN DRIVE ON RIGA IS CHECKED, SAYS PETROGRAD. Position of Czar's Troops Along 675-Mile Front Declared Satisfactory.

PETROGRAD, Oct. 23 (via London).—Russian military authorities regard the situation along the entire front of approximately 675 miles as favorable from their point of view.

Koprlik is a town in Serbia on the Salonica-Nish railway on which the allies are advancing. It is about thirty miles south of Uakub, the principal city of southern Serbia and is about sixty miles north of the Greek border.

BUCHAREST, Oct. 23 (Central News).—In the fighting near Wegotin on the Danube, where Roumania, Serbia and Bulgaria meet, the Bulgarians lost 5,000 men, including the squadron of cavalry who escaped the enemy by swimming the stream into Roumania.

LONDON, Oct. 23.—Heavy movements of allied troops from Salonica toward Serbia are in progress, according to Athens advices to-day.

Official announcement was made to-day in London and Paris of the bombardment of the Bulgarian coast towns.

FRENCH REPORT GERMANS BEATEN IN EVERY ATTACK

Successful Defense Made at Givenchy and in Champagne—Lorraine Trench Taken.

PARIS, Oct. 23.—Following the text of the report issued to-day by the War Office: "Yesterday evening troops of the enemy endeavored to come out from their trenches in the southern part of Bois en Hautes and near the Fort at Givenchy. They were immediately and easily dispersed."

On the Champagne district also strong reconnoitering parties of the enemy, supported by the firing of shells which irritated the eyes and produced suffocation, endeavored to take possession of our positions in the vicinity of Butte de Tabour. These parties were everywhere repulsed and virtually destroyed by the fire of our infantry and machine guns.
