Missourian Was Prominent for Years in Public Affairs of the Nation.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—Francis Marion Cockrell, former United States Senator from Missouri, died here today.

BARNES FAVORS EARLY CONVENTION BY REPUBLICANS

Wants Presidential Candidate Named Week Ahead of Action by Democrats.

(Special From a Staff Correspondent.)

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—William Barnes of New York is seeking to dominate the fortunes of the Republican party. He will attend the meeting of the Republican National Committee to-morrow. Mr. Barnes has two plans of campaign which he will seek to have adopted.

The first plan calls for holding the Republican National Convention ahead of the Democratic Convention instead of following the precedent that the opposition waits for the party in power to show its hand first.

The second plan is for the adoption of an aggressive, definite Republican policy in opposition to the Democratic Administration and attack all along the line.

Mr. Barnes is in an aggressive fighting mood. His normal pugnacity was increased to-day by reports that Col. Roosevelt would be readmitted to the Republican party and be one of the four delegates at large from New

York. He declined even to mention the name of Roosevelt, but he wrote out for The Evening World this cryptic statement:

"I am not responsible for expressions of opinion except such as I make myself. The Republicans of New York will take such action as they see fit from time to time until the date of the primary, April 4. What their action will be is not for me to say."

New York State, according to Mr. Barnes, will have three candidates for President in the field—Elihu Root, Gov. Whitman and Senator Wadsworth. The latter's name is a new mention and some politicians see in it the possibility of some political manoeuvre. Wadsworth is the friend, protege and favorite pupil of Barnes, just as more than a half century ago his grandfather, Thurlow Weed, made William H. Seward his favorite son.

New York State Republicans will hold an informal convention in February to choose their four delegates at large.

This convention is expected to select as the big four Elihu Root, Senator Wadsworth, Gov. Whitman and William Barnes. Then it is for the party primaries on April 4 to pass upon the unofficial acts of the convention.

The Republican National Convention, if the plans of Barnes and the old guards of the party carry, will meet on June 7, a week before the Democrats assemble.

Chairman McCombs of the Democratic Committee thought he had fixed his convention so early as to shut us out," said Mr. Barnes. "But not quite. The latest State primaries are on June 6, in West Virginia and South Dakota. If we fix our date for June 7, the delegates from those States can catch the night sleeper for wherever the convention meets."

"I am for taking the aggressive in this campaign. Why should we wait for the other side to attack us?"

SENATE TAKES OWEN'S STOCK EXCHANGE BILL FROM HIS CONTROL

Oklahoma Member Renews His Attack on New York Brokers, but Has Slim Backing.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—Senator Owen of Oklahoma made another attack to-day on the New York Stock Exchange and again introduced his annual bill to forbid the use of the mails, telephones and telegraph to exchanges if they permit wash sales, matched orders, manipulation or other fraudulent practices.

The Senate, however, rose against Owen and took his own bill out of his charge by voting to refer it to the Committee on Post Offices and Post-Roads instead of to the Committee on Banking and Currency, of which Owen is Chairman. This practically assures its being pigeonholed. Speaking on his bill, Senator Owen said: "At present stock exchanges are privileged associations without any safeguards to the public. They indulge in such practices as matched orders, wash sales and manipulation of stocks by which fictitious prices are made and the public deluded. It is a fraud on the people of the United States."

"The governors of the New York

Stock Exchange at one time gave me assurances that they were strongly desirous of correcting these evils, but found it exceedingly difficult to accomplish as a private association.

"The purpose of this bill is to require exchanges to take out charters which shall contain provisions against fraudulent practices. If charter provisions are violated then the post office shall withhold privilege of the mails and use of telephones and telegraph. Through the stock exchanges our country has been thrown into panic. The enormous resources of New York banks are used to carry on transactions of the exchanges. This bill comes properly under jurisdiction of the Banking and Currency Committee."

Senators Hitchcock of Nebraska and Bankhead of Alabama, both Democrats, led the fight against Owen to take away from him any further connection with stock exchange legislation. Roll call showed prac-

tically all Republican Senators and half the Democrats aligned against him.

GET \$88,515 FOR BOY SCOUTS

Collector Malone Says Plattburgh "Chinified" Him.

With \$6,012.50 raised to-day for the Boy Scouts of America, making the total in the \$200,000 campaign \$18,515.50, the series of noon-day luncheons at No. 27 Chambers Street was abandoned.
