

**BRONX DOES HONOR TO JUSTICE TIERNEY AT LAWYERS' DINNER**

Praised for His Fine Record, and a Toast Is Drunk to President Wilson.

Supreme Court Justice John M. Tierney was the guest of honor at the annual banquet of the Bar Association of the Bronx, held at Ebling's Casino, the Bronx, last night. Three hundred guests, attorneys and Bronx business men, paid honor to the new Supreme Court Justice and welcomed his fellow Justices, John Proctor Clarke, Edward R. Finch, Leonard A. Giegerich, Arthur R. Tompkins and Justice-Appointed George V. Mullan.

Maurice S. Cohen, newly elected president of the Bar Association, was toastmaster. In his address he urged that the Bronx demand of its national representatives that they help to put a stop to the talk at Washington and take steps to put through some of the President's preparedness programs at once. Then all present drank to the health of President Wilson.

Presiding Justice of the Appellate Court John Proctor Clarke praised Justice Tierney for his record of eighteen years as a municipal Court Justice. Justice Edward R. Finch, Justice Arthur R. Tompkins and all the other speakers praised Justice Tierney for his work and praised the Bronx for rewarding his faithful service to the public.

"In his work," said Justice Tompkins, "we have an example of the highest grade, the greatest ability rewarded by a worthy elevation."

**HIS RUSH TO HOSPITAL DOES NOT HELP VICTIM**

Woman Struck by Miller's Auto Will Die—Score in Trolley Car Prisoned by Collision.

Mrs. Agnes Ward, whose address the police were unable to obtain, was struck by an automobile when crossing Columbus Avenue at Ninety-ninth street last night. She will die. The car was driven by Howard Miller, a salesman, of No. 137 East Thirty-seventh Street. After he had struck the woman he picked her up and carried her to the Park Hospital at One Hundredth Street and Central Park West. He was arrested, charged with felonious assault. It was said he ran his car into an "L" pillar in trying to avoid hitting the woman.

Twenty scared men and women were prisoners in a Gates Avenue car for ten minutes last night after an emergency automobile truck had struck it at Knickerbocker Avenue, Brooklyn. Louis Pfeiffer, a garage owner of No. 811 Lexington Avenue, driver of the machine, and his helper, George Spert, of No. 253 Troy Avenue, were buried under the machine. Pfeiffer was badly hurt. The street car was off the side of the road, and when the car put the power out of commission the doors would not open. The passengers were liberated by firemen, who cut into the wheels with axes.
