**Concert Day,  
With No Rival  
Opera Show**

THERE'S no opera yesterday. But of concerts there were more than a plenty. In the afternoon, at Carnegie Hall, William Wade Hinshaw, the well-known American baritone, gave a recital accompanied at the piano by the accomplished Kurt Schindler, who is also conductor and composer. Mr. Hinshaw's program began with Handel, included songs by Schumann, Schubert, Dvorak and Jensen, in foreign tongues, and ended

with an English group by Horatio Parker, Sidney Homer, Henry Hadley and Mr. Schindler. Mr. Hinshaw's big voice shined best in Handel's "Alcina" recitative and aria and in Schubert's "Alma" and Schumann's "The Organ Grinder." Sidney Homer's "The Builder of Domes" and Kurt Schindler's "From a City Window" were sung simultaneously. Dvorak's "Gipsy Moodies" also found favor. Simultaneously, Tom Lodson, accompanying himself at the piano, whose voice is nothing but colour with but who has rich gifts of interpretation and an iridescent personal magnetism, gave a recital at the Punch and Judy Theatre. Also simultaneously, at the Harris Theatre, Max Landow, pianist, gave a recital of which Schumann's sonata in F sharp major, a Chopin group, and Liszt's "Symphonie Concert Solo" were the principal numbers. Mr. Landow's technique is well-nigh impeccable, but his playing leaves an impression of coldness. Then, at Maxine Elliott's Theatre, La Argentina, the Spanish dancer, assisted by The Little Symphony Orchestra, George Harzere, conductor, presented a programme of Spanish dances, of which Valverde's "Mi Chiquita," a song with castanets, Massenet's "Sevillana," from "Don Cesar de Bazan," and Valverde's "Allegria," a descriptive dance of a bull fight, were most applauded. La Argentina has found favor here. If an Irishman thought nobody could be in two places at the same time unless he was a bird, what about four?

Julia Culp, the eminent Dutch lieder singer, and Eddy Brown, the young American violinist who has made a hit with a variety of audi-

ences during this, his first season here, were the soloists at the second private concert of the Rubinstein Club at the Waldorf-Astoria last night. It for nothing else. Mrs. Culp's clear enunciation of English was a treat. It might well furnish a model for American and English singers to copy. The club's chorus of 125 women's voices sang well under the direction of William Rogers Chapman. There was a crush that prevented even Mrs. Chapman, the President. A large number of invited guests were unable to get into the grand ballroom, even to stand up.
