"The Out-of-Doors Man" by Cartaino Sciarino Pietro, is a delightful rendering of John Burroughs as seen at Siabades. In a seated pose he is shown gazing into the far distance. Miss Eugenie Frederica Shonnard has made a very sympathetic study of a Marabout, or West African stork, for a state post.

Sherry E. Fry sends a conventional type of nude woman, with right leg resting gracefully upon a dolphin. A trident is grasped in the left hand. The pose is a good one. "The Athlete," by Rudolph Evans, is a finely modeled figure of a man with a pike. It would not, however, cut much ice in a contest with the modern poison mass. Helen Farnsworth Mears is represented by several pieces. Among them is a cotton-tail rabbit, which enters into her Fountain of Joy as a detail. It is modeled standing erect, with uplifted ears and folded paws. Robert Aitken has designed a pretty sundial for which he has utilized a faun, with goat legs and tail, and the characteristic horned head and pendant ears. The faun holds the shell base of the dial. A small crawls along the edge of the scolloped shell.


