Newman and Fredericks, the former in evening dress, were arraigned before Magistrate Barlow in the West Side Court on a charge of unlawful entry.


CONVICT MODIFIES TALE OF ARNOLD GIRL'S BURIAL


Obesity Reducing Exercises for Women Presented in a Series of Handy Charts

Arranged by PAULINE FURLONG. CHART NO. 22 OBESITY REDUCTION SIDE BODY BENDING—REDUCES WAIST AND ABDOMEN.



FIRST—Stand with feet together, hands on hips. SECOND—Bend the body to right side, keeping knees rigid, and touch floor with tips of fingers of right hand. THIRD—Return to upright position and relax all muscles. FOURTH—Bend body to left side, touching floor with tips of fingers of left hand.
