NEW YORK CENTRAL REFUSES DEMANDS OF ITS SIGNAL MEN

Employees Say They Will Strike To-Night and Company Hires Strikebreakers.

NO HALT OF TRAFFIC. Officials Say a Walkout Will Not Affect Operation of the Lines.

It was officially announced by the New York Central Railroad today that the demand of the telegraphers and signal men for increased wages and better hours will not be granted.

While the announcement was being made hundreds of strike breakers were being rushed to various points along the New York Central and the Nickel Plate Railroads in the belief that the proposed strike of the signal men and telegraphers is the first move of a general railroad strike affecting the big Eastern lines.
