The Count is so deeply hurt that he rushes back to Vienna, followed in due time by Molly O'Malley, who wears jacket and trousers at a student's ball that gives the second act considerable color.

A newcomer, Katherine Galloway, as well as Molly, Tall, dark-haired and attractive, she made an agreeable impression. "When Fortune Smiles" was one of the songs in which she scored. Grace Fieiss danced charmingly and had two good partners in Donald Crane and Donald Macdonald. Miss Field also sang pleasingly and looked decidedly fetching in her pretty frocks. Though necessarily peevish as the noble hero, Albert Parr displayed great enthusiasm in singing and used his voice to advantage. John E. Young dashed really through the performance with pretty maidens smiling hopefully upon him. **BUILD PORTABLE HOUSES FOR BELGIAN REFUGEES**

When They Return Home Britain Will Send Them Homes With Them.

CHICAGO, May 22.—Britain's problem of housing 200,000 Belgian refugees has been in part solved by

the building of wooden houses, so constructed that when the war is over they may be taken down and shipped to Belgium to replace destroyed dwellings there. This statement was made here today by the Hon. Percy Allen, Member of Parliament, at present engaged in relief work.

He said the care of the Belgians in England requires \$2,000,000 a month. In addition, he said, there are 3,500,000 remaining in Belgium who must look to other countries for food. About half, he estimated, were able to pay for what they eat.
