**Obesity Reduction Course For Women**

**QUESTION AND ANSWER COLUMN**

**Dislodging Superfluous Fat.**

Removing the rolls of superfluous fat from the shoulder blades is one of the most difficult problems with which the stout woman has to contend. It is caused by the tight corset, forcing the flesh up from its rightful place around the waist and abdomen and holding it in this position without free blood circulation, on the shoulders until it permanently forms unsightly bunches of unhealthy inert tissue.

All of the exercises shown in the recent charts will help to dislodge and remove this superfluous flesh on the shoulders and also reduce the fat upper arm, as they combine movements which bring practically every muscle of the body into play. Heavy massage with an ordinary rolling pin will also aid materially in removing the rolls of fat and it will never appear again if the proper fitting corset is used and several minutes with the arm exercises practiced each day.

Bag punching is another exercise which is beneficial in this case and is used extensively in the professional gymnasia for fat on shoulders.

**Letters From Readers.**

**WHICH CHARTS TO USE—MRS. L. T. McC.** writes: "I am fifty years of age and am 5 feet 7 inches tall. What should I weigh? You have given two charts of exercises. Should both be practiced same day?"  
For 5 feet 7 you should weigh 150 pounds, bust 32.5, waist 27.1, thighs 22.4, hips 39.4, calf 14.5, ankle 8.5. Ten pounds more or less either way will not make a great difference on account of the different size of various frames. As a great number of charts have been given, I do not quite understand your second query. Anyway you should take about five or ten minutes' exercise twice each day, practicing the ones you decide you need most after reading the description printed with them.

**PAINS IN ARMS AND HANDS—MRS. R. W.** writes: "What can I do for severe pains in arms and hands? I have them continually."  
These are probably rheumatic pains. First you should consult your physician about this, because it is not an easy matter to tell what the trouble is from such a brief outline. A clean system, to remove the poisons and waste from the body, is the first treatment for rheumatic pains. Drink quantities of water and practice the stretching and deep breathing exercises each day for five minutes, or more if convenient.

**FAT FACE—CARRIE I.** writes: "Have very stout face and large, heavy jaws. Can you suggest a remedy?"  
The neck and chin exercises should remove the fat from the lower face. Of course, if the bones in the face and jaws are large and square this cannot be remedied. The chin strap will hold up the jaws and also reduce the fat on the chin.

**RAISINS FOR CONSTIPATION—RENA G.** writes: "A friend of mine from the West told me several months ago to eat raisins and chew seeds and all and swallow them to cure constipation. I take about a quarter of a pound of them a day and they have cured me entirely. Do you think the continued use of them, with the seeds, will harm me eventually? As I enjoy eating them and find them a real cure of constipation, I should dislike to give them up."  
The raisins and seeds will not harm you, if chewed well, and will help overcome constipation. Raisins are nourishing and fattening.

**TENDER FEET AND FOOT ODORS—MARGARET T.** writes: "Give me a recipe for tender, aching feet and bad odors from perspiration."  
Bathe the feet in hot water and soap for five minutes at least once each day. Then soak them in very cold salt water for ten minutes. Rub briskly with a rough towel and mop up some of the following mixture: Salicylic acid, 1/2 ounce; alcohol, 4 ounces. Powder the feet with talcum.




