

DELAY FOR BURNS AT INQUIRY INTO HIS WIRE TAPPING

Detective Agency Head Was on Hand to Tell of His Work for Morgan Company.

Although William J. Burns, the head of the detective agency which at the instance of J. P. Morgan & Company installed a detectaphone in the law offices of Seymour & Seymour in the Equitable Building, was present to-day when Chief Magistrate McAdoo resumed his investigation of the "tapping" of the telephone wires in the Seymour offices, he was not put upon the stand. His counsel, James M. Beck, requested an adjournment until 11 o'clock to-morrow on account of an engagement.

Martin Egan of the Morgan firm, was then called to the stand and was briefly questioned by District Attorney Egan.

Q. Did you receive from William J. Burns copies of papers alleged to have been made in the Seymour offices? A. Yes, about twenty typewritten pages—it was the Humboldt Fibre Company correspondence.

Q. Burns told you he had made them from originals in the Seymour office? A. He gave me to understand he had made them there.

Q. Did Burns give you anything documentary save what he found in the Seymour office? A. I think it would defeat the ends of justice to answer that question.

SULTZER IS ON TRIAL.

Seymour & Seymour Employee Is Accused of "Killing Checks."

Morton B. Sultzer, the young employee of Seymour & Seymour who has figured in the wire-tapping investigation, was placed on trial for grand larceny to-day before a jury and Supreme Court Justice Benton.

In his opening address Charles H. Noxon, counsel for Sultzer, declared that he would show that if it were not for the fact that the young man happened to go into the employ of Seymour & Seymour the charge against him would never have been made.

Assistant District Attorney N. W. O'Keefe said that Sultzer had "killed checks" after a disastrous season at raising blooded chickens on his farm at Darien, Conn. The prosecutor said Sultzer drew a check for \$25 when he knew he did not have \$20 in the bank.

WORSHIPPERS RUN DOWN ROBBER OF POOR BOX

Man Caught After Chase From Church Declares He Was Hungry and Had Right to Money.

When James Watson, thirty-eight, who said his home was at No. 231 North Tenth Street, Philadelphia, was arraigned in Jefferson Market Police Court to-day, charged with trying to rob a poor box in St. Francis Xavier's Church, No. 20 West Sixteenth Street, last evening, he defiantly declared that, as he was out of work and hungry, he was entitled to church money.

Miss Anna Flint of No. 48 West Twentieth Street, a communicant of the church, was kneeling before an altar last evening when she saw the man opening a poor box.

When Watson saw he was discovered, Miss Flint says, he threatened to kill her but she called to several other worshippers. Watson ran from the church and a dozen men and women pursued him through Sixteenth Street to Fifth Avenue and thence to Fifteenth Street, where he hid in a loft building. There Police-man Brien of the West Twentieth Street Station arrested him.

The police said to-day that Watson had been arrested fifteen times for robbing poor boxes.

OSBORNE GOING BACK AS SING SING WARDEN

Gov. Whitman Intimates That This Will Follow Exoneration on All Charges.

ALBANY, May 31.—Thomas Mott Osborne will return to Sing Sing Prison as Warden of the institution if he is exonerated on all the charges for which he was indicted Gov. Whitman intimated to-day. In speaking of the reported intention of George W. Kirchwey to resign the Wardenship of Sing Sing, the Governor said that when Mr. Osborne was retired

from the office a account of the indictments, it was understood by the Governor, Mr. Kirchwey, Mr. Osborne and John B. Riley, then Superintendent of Prisons, that he would be restored to office in the event of his exoneration.

"As a matter of honor and justice," the Governor said, "Mr. Osborne, if cleared of the charges against him, should resume the wardenship of Sing Sing. This, however, is a matter over which Supt. Carter of the Prison Department has control, and I cannot say positively what action will be taken."

Thomas M. Osborne said to-day that within a few days he will ask the State Superintendent of Prisons to reappoint him as Warden of Sing Sing.

"By July I expect to be back as Warden," said Mr. Osborne.
