

POLICE LIEUTENANT SHOOTSELF AND DIES IN SON'S ARMS

Boy Kept Vigil All Night to Prevent J. T. Smith From Taking Life.

Two minutes after the sound of a shot came from a little wood at the corner of Two Hundred and Thirty-fourth Street and Katonah Avenue, the Bronx, at 5:28 A. M. to-day, a boy dashed in among the trees and came upon the body of a man in uniform. In the man's right hand was a smoking revolver. In his left hand was a small mirror. In his right temple was a bullet wound. The man was the boy's father, Police Lieut. John T. Smith. Three minutes later he died in his son's arms.

All night long the boy, William, eighteen years old, had sat outside his father's door, unknown to the police officer, and kept vigil to prevent his father from ending his life. When Lieut. Smith left home, No. 24 East Two Hundred and Thirty-fifth Street, early this morning to report for duty, the lad followed him, still apprehensive that his father would seek to kill himself. He was a block behind Lieut. Smith when he saw him turn into the wood. The boy realized what that meant and broke into a run, but arrived too late. For six months Lieut. Smith had been obsessed with the belief that he was slowly dying from cancer. He had grown more despondent as the disease, so he believed, continued to progress. A few days ago his physician, Dr. McChristie, of No. 1058 Cauldwell Avenue, the Bronx, had an X-ray photograph taken to determine if Lieut. Smith really had a cancer. Dr. McChristie was glad to tell the lieutenant that the photograph showed he had no cancer. But the news did not seem to cheer Lieut. Smith.
