Berlin Admits Another Rout on the Macedonian Front Near Florina.

BERLIN (Via Wireless to N.Y.), Sept. 16.—A further retreat by the Bulgarian right wing in Northern Greece was officially admitted by the German War Office this afternoon.

From the Struma to the Vardar the cannonading continues to be violent. There was skirmishing at the foot of the Belas Mountains and in the regions of Vetrnik and Kajmakchalan we made substantial progress.

"On our left wing Franco-Russian troops advanced beyond the line of the Heights of Malareka and continued to press forward victoriously in the region of Florina. One of our aerial squadrons dropped a number of projectiles on Monastir."
