BULGARIANS SHELLED BY BRITISH WARSHIPS

Aeroplanes Bombard Anglia Railway Station on the Macedonian Front.

LONDON, Sept. 30.—The following official report from the Macedonian front was made public here today: "On both the Drama and the Durran fronts there has been the usual patrol activity on both sides."

SO. IA IS BOMBARDED BY FRENCH AVIATOR

Bombs Are Dropped in Flight from the Macedonian Front in Thracian.

PARIS, Sept. 30 (via London).—The War Office announced today that a French aeroplane, starting yesterday from a point on the Macedonian front, passed over Bulgaria, dropping bombs on Sofia, and continued its flight to Bucharest.

TEN MISSING FROM TORPEDOED STEAMSHIP

British Ship Thurso Hit Presumably in North Sea—Another Vessel Sunk.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—With ten of her crew missing and nine landed, the British steamer Thurso is believed sinking. Consul General Skinner at London cabled the State Department today.

AMERICAN CONSUL AT BARCELONA, SPAIN, REPORTING TO-DAY THE SINKING OF THE ITALIAN STEAMER BENEDETTI, AND THE ITALIAN STEAMER MITOGLIO, SAID THAT NO AMERICANS WERE ABOARD EITHER SHIP.

BRITISH PUSH ON AT THIEPVAL; NEW ARMY IN BATTLE

Heavy Counter Attacks of Germans Beaten Off, Haig Reports.

FRENCH ADD TO GAINS. Joffre's Forces Make Further Progress North of Rancourt With Grenade Attacks.

LONDON, Sept. 30.—Unusually heavy fighting occurred yesterday on the Somme front, in consequence of German counter-attacks. A division of the new British army was engaged.

ALL GREEK AIRMEN JOIN ALLIED FLEET, ATHENS REPORTS

Venezelos, at Crete, Said to Be in Full Control of Revolution.

ATHENS, Sept. 30.—The entire Greek flying corps has joined the allied fleet. LONDON, Sept. 30.—Delayed despatches from Crete, describing the arrival there of Venizelos and Admiral Kountouriotis, indicate that the former Premier of Greece is in full control of the revolutionary situation.

BRITISH ATTACKS ON THE SOMME REPULSED, SAYS BERLIN REPORT

BERLIN, Sept. 30 (via London).—The repulse of strong British attacks on the Somme front is recorded in today's official communication, which follows:

"As on the preceding day, the British attacked yesterday with strong forces between Ancre and Courcellette. After variable hand-to-hand fighting they were repulsed. Otherwise there were only minor local advances and artillery duels, which increased in activity during the afternoon, north of the Somme and in a few sectors south of the Rivir."

92 SQUARE MILES OF TERRITORY RETAKEN BY ALLIES ON SOMME

GRAND HEADQUARTERS OF THE FRENCH ARMIES, Sept. 30 (United Press).—In the first thirteen weeks of the Somme offensive, the French and British have captured more ground than has been taken by the Germans in more than six months of battling at Verdun.

A survey of the results of the great allied drive, halted temporarily yesterday by a terrific downpour of rain, shows that the allies have conquered 285 square kilometers of French territory (about ninety-two square miles), exceeding by fifteen kilometers the territory gained by the Germans at Verdun.

GERMAN U-BOATS SANK 262 SHIPS IN THREE MONTHS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—Much more complete information of Germany's submarine activities which supplements Lord Robert Cecil's statement in London last night was received in despatches from London arriving here today, which show that between June 1 and Sept. 21 262 vessels of all nationalities have been sunk by submarines.

Of those fifteen were reported sunk without warning, with the loss of eighty-four lives. A total of sixty-six neutral vessels were destroyed during the period.

ROUMANIAN ARMY IS IN UTTER ROUT IN TRANSYLVANIA

Berlin Says Austro-Germans Have Won Big Victory at Hermannstadt.

BERLIN, Sept. 30 (via London).—Troops under Gen. von Falkenhayn, former Chief of the General Staff, have won a battle at Hermannstadt, Transylvania, defeating strong sections of the Rumanian Army, the War Office announced today.

STEEL BEATEN DOWN IN STIFF BEAR RAID

TRACTION STRIKERS GET \$55,000 BENEFIT TO-DAY

Men Idle Three Weeks to Be Paid \$5 Each by Amalgamated Association.

The striking street car employees assembled at eight meeting places in Manhattan, the Bronx and Westchester today to receive the first payment of strike benefits. Organizer Fitzgerald, soon after the opening of banking hours, cashed checks on a Detroit bank amounting to \$55,000 and sent his assistants out to distribute the money.
