## ONE KILLED AS TRAIN HITS CART AND RAMS FREIGHT

Hundreds of Munition Workers Shaken Up by Crash in Outskirts of Bridgeport.

(Special to The Evening World.)

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Oct. 3.—One man and two horses were killed and several hundred munition workers were badly shaken up to-day when a passenger train speeding along at thirty miles an hour, on its way to this city from Newtown, Conn., struck a dump cart at a grade crossing near the outskirts of Bridgeport. In addition to killing Edward Breen, driver of the cart, and the horses, the cart was thrown against an automatic switch, the blow opening the switch and sending the passenger train on to a spur track where, still going at considerable speed, it crashed into a freight train as the latter was crossing a viaduct fifteen feet above the street.

Following the second crash the passenger engine broke away from the passenger cars and plunged to the pavement below, landing on a moving van filled with furniture. A few minutes later the engine blew up with a loud report. Robert Burns, engineer, and H. E. Hennessey, fireman, jumped before the engine toppled off the viaduct. Hennessey sustained a scalp wound. The driver of the moving van also jumped in time to save himself.

Aged Woman Ends Life With Gas. Forcing the door of a room at No. 314 Vermont Street, East New York, early

to-day, Jacob Feurst, a tenant, and Policeman Stegler found the dead body of Mrs. Mary Conowski, sixty years old, who had lived there alone for three years. She had committed suicide by inhaling gas. A note, written on a piece of wall paper, asked that she be given Hebrew burial.
