There are forty-four Broadway chorus girls in Raymond Hitchcock's new starring vehicle, "Betty," at the Globe, and, according to Harry Kline, at least half the number own, or have the use of, automobiles.

Last week it became necessary for the "Betty" management to issue an order forbidding the chorus girls to have their cars call at the theatre for them at the close of the show. The young ladies were told their autos were blocking the traffic in West Forty-sixth Street and were causing discomfort for patrons of the house who use machines. The girls condescended to observe the order and, as a result, the patrons now have a chance to get away from the theatre without inconvenience.

Now the announcement comes from the Globe that the chorus girls who own autos are to provide their chauffeurs with a clubroom in West Forty-sixth Street near the theatre.

Verily, Maggie McGinn is a relic of the past. Were she on Broadway to-day she'd be as lonesome as a corn-stalk fiddle in a bass viol factory.
