THE NEW PLAYS

"Come Out of the Kitchen"
An Amiable Masquerade

WELL, anyway, she knew how to cook! This much, at least, may be said for the heroine of "Come Out of the Kitchen," the comedy by A. E. Thomas that put Ruth Chatterton into capital letters last night at the Cohan Theatre.

In shrinking type we were informed that the play is based on a story by Alice Duer Miller. That Henry Miller should have produced it means nothing more, perhaps, than his faith in the young actress who made her real strides in "Daddy Long-Legs." The ingenue is always worth her weight in gold at the box office if she can act—and Miss Chatterton still displays unmistakable symptoms of acting. She puts on a gingham apron, a matter-of-fact expression, and, behold! she is "natural," as the saying goes. In her simple way, she represents the eternal feminine—and this comedy is essentially feminine. If it doesn't please the matinee girl, so much the worse for her.

"Come Out of the Kitchen" is little more than an amiable masquerade. Members of one of those Southern families that we still read about with more or less patience turn themselves into servants because of financial pressure, and dance attendance upon a Northern—ancient as the term may be! The head of the household, we hear, is undergoing an operation in Germany, and his life insurance hangs so uncertainly in the balance that everything depends upon the rental that the gentleman from the North has agreed to pay for the place. It only remains for the fairest of the Daingerfields to serve as cook and win the heart of the Northern in three days. What more can be said for good cooking?

The dinner in the last act might just as well take place in the first act, though it is amusing, and finally gives way to a charmingly flirtatious scene between the daughter of the South and the bold adventurer from the North. If the dinner is drawn out at great length, the curtain falls quickly upon the romance that has been "cooked up" on the kitchen stove. There are kisses, cooking and simmering and emotions, though the real flavor of comedy is missing. As for Olivia, quite aside from her knowledge of pots and pans, she can scarcely be accepted as "a proud Southern beauty," in view of the fact that she virtually begs Crane not to break the lease of her father's house.

In this role Miss Chatterton made sad work of a Southern dialect during the earlier part of the play. She was much more at her ease with the Irish accent devised for the cook. It was a happy thought on the part of Mr. Thomas to make the character a combination of Bunsy and Peg o' My Heart. Bruce McRae was as good natured as usual, though he barked in a way that made him quite unrecognizable at times in the vague role of Crane. Marguerite St. John played a grande dame with a haughty air,

MELON FOR EMPLOYEES.

Underwood Co. to Give Workmen 20 Per Cent. of Net Surplus.
HARTFORD, Conn. Oct. 24.—Under an agreement announced to-day by the Underwood Typewriter Company, whose factory is the largest here, employing 1,000, the workmen will become shareholders in the company and participate in profit-sharing of \$100,000. The company will pay each February to five trustees, who shall have full power over investments and withdrawals, 10 per cent. of its net surplus for the fiscal year of 1918, which will be deposited to the account of each employee who has been with the company two years or more prior to Jan. 1, 1917.


