

CITY PENSION EXPERT PUFFS HIS PIPE AS HE ENDS LIFE WITH GAS

Robert von Reutlinger Makes Bed in Bathroom for Suicide.

Robert von Reutlinger, forty years old, an investigator for the Bureau of Municipal Research and for two years actively identified with Mayor Mitchell's administration in the capacity of a pension expert, committed suicide early to-day by inhaling gas in the bathroom of his two-room suite, at No. 123 West Eightieth Street.

The man set about ending an interesting career in the most deliberate manner. Last night he dined out with friends, returning to his apartment after midnight. Some time after reaching home he transferred his bed, mattress, covers and pillows to the bathroom. After stuffing all the openings in the doors and windows he calmly lit his pipe, turned on the gas and lay down to await the end.

von Reutlinger was a distinguished looking man of soldierly bearing, a Russian of German extraction who was educated at the military school in Kieff, Russia.

MAYO MUST TESTIFY IN \$250,000 LOVE SUIT

Court Rules Millionaire is Deprived of Privilege Not to Answer Questions.

Virginia St. Julian Mayo, New Haven millionaire, must answer all questions concerning his varied matrimonial career. Supreme Court Justice Cohan has decided to-day in the \$250,000 breach of promise suit brought against Mayo by Wilhelmina Meyer, a Newark heiress, who lived with the millionaire until she discovered her marriage to him was illegal.

Mayo has vigorously fought Miss Meyer's attempt to compel him to testify. "The wrongful act of bigamy," says Justice Cohan, "is alleged to have been committed on April 2, 1904, and the time for finding an indictment has expired. Thus the claim of privilege does not apply to his testimony. I am satisfied that Mayo, having denied the wrongful acts under oath in his verified answer, he thereby deprived himself of his privilege not to answer even though he still be subject to incriminating himself."


