The work of the Housewives' Protective Association is beginning to bear fruit. Urged by this association, Commissioner Dillon has demanded that all the eggs in storage be marked "storage."

In co-operation with this association, he is working on a terminal market plan to submit to the Legislature. Commissioner Dillon is working in the interest of a coal ordinance that will eliminate short weights to small consumers, also a strongly advocated by this association.

Reactionary Calls President a "Babbling Blackguard"—He Resigns, Is Re-Elected.

PETROGRAD, Dec. 6.—Michael Rodzianko, President of the Duma, has resigned after being insulted by the Extreme Right leader, M. Markoff, who interrupted M. Rodzianko and called him a "babbling blackguard."

M. Markoff explained that he was deliberately insulting the Duma in the person of its President because the Duma in a previous sitting had insulted high personages. M. Rodzianko immediately left the chair, declaring he had been insulted not only as President but as a man.


