

**MR. JOHN J. KEAN DEAD;
ILL FOR SEVERAL MONTHS**

Rector of Holy Name Parish,
Widely Known and One of the
Most Active Men in Diocese.

Mr. John J. Kean, sixty-four years
old, rector of the Roman Catholic
Church of the Holy Name, and one
of the most widely known priests in
the diocese, is dead at the rectory,
Amsterdam Avenue and Ninety-sixth
Street.

Mr. Kean was especially active in
furthering the cause of church mu-
sic. He was a member of the Church
Music Committee, had charge of the
chorus of 7,000 children that wel-
comed Cardinal Farley home five
years ago and was often, on account
of his voice, called on to sing mass
at the cathedral on festival occasions.

Appointed to the Church of the
Holy Name in 1907, Mr. Kean was
given his title by Pope Pius X. in
1911. His time was much occupied
with diocesan work as the head of
Board of Examiners for Administra-
tive Removal, member of the Com-
mittee of Examiners for the Clergy,
member of the Board of Examiners
for Teachers and a member of the
Board of Trustees of the funds for
the infirm priests of the archdiocese.
He died Saturday, after an illness of
several months.

Members of the parish will be per-
mitted to view the body which will
lie in state in the church from to-
morrow afternoon at 3 o'clock until
10 o'clock to-morrow night. The of-
fice for the dead will be opened at
10 o'clock Wednesday by priests of

the diocese and this will be followed
by a solemn requiem mass.
Cardinal Farley is expected to be
present at the office and mass and,
if so, he will give the absolution to
the body.
