The meetings are designed to meet the needs of those who desire to know what patriotism means to real Americans, whether native or foreign born; to let them hear the reasons back of our system of city, State and national Government from the lips of the very men who administer the Government. Those who have cooperated with The Evening World in the project are steadfast believers in the principle that to understand the principles of the Government of the United States is to love that Government and to admire with patriotic devotion the wisdom and greatness of spirit of its founders.

The principal speaker to-night will be Police Commissioner Arthur Woods, who, from the time he assumed his present office, has bent his efforts most successfully to breaking down the old system of police-men as bullying, nagging instruments of a selfish, czar-like person at Police Headquarters and to make their relations to the people on the streets and in their homes that of strong, clear headed elder brothers, helpful in time of trouble and stern only in the face of stubborn and willful wrongdoing. The Commissioner, who showed his faith in American ideals by attending the Plattsburg camps with a great many of his subordinates, will also dwell on the reasonableness of many laws and ordinances which may seem irksome to individuals but are necessary to the best interests of the whole when actually and fairly enforced by a properly trained and disciplined Police Department.

Municipal Justice Aaron J. Levy will preside at the meeting and will make an address. There will also be speeches by Nisim Behar of the National Liberal Education League and others. School Commissioner Joseph Barondea has been asked to make a speech in Yiddish summarizing the proceedings for those who, as yet, know no English. Music will be furnished by the Hebrew Orphan Asylum Band. Each and every person with attend will be presented with an American flag.

Among those who have promised to be present and to advise with those who desire information as to the process of becoming citizens, or in making out their first naturalization papers are Assemblyman Abraham Goodman, who introduced the bill providing for the use of school buildings by the Americanization Forum; Assemblyman Nathan D. Perlman; Nathaniel Phillips of the League of Foreign-Born Citizens, William West of the Educational Alliance, Dr. Julius Froder of the Business and Professional Men's League, and Horace Bradstreet of Madison Street House.
