

WHITE RATS' STRIKE CALLED A JOKE, BUT ACTORS LAUGH, TOO

Performers Elated Over Success of Walkout—Theatre Managers Unconcerned.

The White Rats, an organization of vaudeville performers, say that their strike against the Vaudeville Managers' Protective Association in general and the Marcus Loew theatres in particular is a gratifying success. The management of the Loew theatres says the strike is a joke, that all the performers needed can and will be obtained and that "so long as the feature film exists Mr. Loew should worry." And that's the state of affairs to-day in the White Rats strike, plus, of course, the announcement that both sides "are confident of ultimate victory."

The strike, which has been threatened for a month, was called last night when the first show of the new half week bill was about to begin. Mr. Loew and his lieutenants had to do a lot of hustling to fill the vacancies in the bills of the American, Lincoln Square, Delancey and Seventh Avenue Theatres of this city, the Fulton, Orpheum and National of Brooklyn, the Lyric of Hoboken, Loew's of Newark and two theatres in Boston.

Joseph M. Schreck, general manager of the Loew circuit, said to-day: "This strike is a joke. The Loew interests are not badly concerned, because we have ten acts ready for every one that has gone out. A great number of acts not performed by White Rats have already been summoned to our offices and arrangements made to put them on at once. Anyhow, people don't ask now who the headliners are—they ask what the feature film—the Loew interest—is all right, whatever happens."

Gordon Whyte, publicity representative of the White Rats in the strike, said:

"All the Loew houses have been hard hit save those in Fall River, Memphis, Toronto, Providence and Atlanta, which have week-end bills. We didn't want to call out the actors

there, because they were too far from home, but next week these houses will be brought in.

"No violence will be attempted in this strike, but every moral influence will be brought to bear to urge actors not to play at the Loew theatres. The stage hands and orchestras are not involved, nor is there any assurance that they will be. We are going to succeed in this strike, and when we have finished with Mr. Loew, other circuits will be similarly taken up."

In order that the White Rats may know their competitors, there is a large signboard in the lobby of their clubhouse in West Forty-sixth Street bearing the names of seventy-five vaudeville acts designated as "scabs."

The White Rats are striking for 5 per cent. booking commissions, not more than three performances a day, a more generous contract and a closed shop. They say they'll arbitrate any of their demands save that for the closed shop.

BOY AVENGER OF FATHER EXONERATED BY JURY

As His Parent Lay Dead in the Street Son Seized His Gun and Killed the Murderer.

CROWBURY, Kan., March 5.—Eleven-year-old Joe Vinardi went back to school to-day exonerated by law, after having avenged in blood the killing of his father. A coroner's jury returned a verdict of self-defense absolving the boy from blame for the death here last Monday of Mike Gilio, author for the hand of Joe's sister and an enemy of Giannetto Vinardi, Joe's father.

There was a feud between the elder Vinardi and Gilio because of Gilio's attentions to Vinardi's daughter. Monday night they met. Both were armed. Next day both were found dead, and it was at first believed they had killed each other, but the inquest revealed the following facts: Vinardi, the elder, lying mortally wounded, instructed his son to obtain vengeance. His father's shotgun in hand, the boy shortly afterward found Gilio in front of his home. Gilio had a shotgun also. He pointed it at the boy and laughed at him, whereupon Joe Vinardi fired, killing Gilio.
