**ARMY RECRUITING SPURRED BY WORK OF CITY BUREAUS**

**New Rochelle and Stamford Yacht Clubs Pledge Gifts of \$100,000 Boats.**

Young America never had a better opportunity than now to show the staff that it is made of. With Mayors all over the country co-operating with Mayor Mitchell's Recruiting Committee at No. 50 East Forty-second Street and hundreds of clerks at convenient places ready to enroll recruits for the army, the work took on a more practical aspect to-day. All the recruiting offices in the New

York district under Col. Walsh were packed at 9 o'clock this morning. At the Sixth Avenue headquarters for the west side the crowd filled the main room and army officials took over another one which will be fitted up immediately for examination purposes.

This is only one of scores of such telegrams received this morning. The army stationed a man in front of the office of the Mayor's Committee to catch the tide on Forty-second Street. Army officials have under consideration opening headquarters at the "Bully" Sunday Tabernacle.

The aim of the Mayor's Committee is to concentrate its hardest work on recruiting for the navy. Mayors and Governors from all parts of the country have generally responded to the suggestion for a Paul Revere celebration, Lexington Day, April 19. Gov. Manning of South Carolina sent word to-day to Alexander J. Hemp-hall, chairman of the committee, that his State will not be found wanting in the national round-up for both army and navy.

The local plan for the Paul Revere celebration contemplates night rides all over the city of "1917 Paul Revere," summoning New York to the colors. This telegram was received to-day from the Mayor of Amarillo, Texas:

"We are with our country and the President first and last. We have just observed loyalty day and our entire citizenship responded. But we have lots of pep left. Send us your programme and count us in."

Commodore Robert E. Tod, of the Naval Reserve Headquarters at No. 26 Cortlandt Street, was notified to-day that the New Rochelle and Stamford Yacht Clubs had pledged themselves to supply \$100,000 each for the purchase of two 110-foot submarine destroyers to be given to the reserve. The ships will be similar to those already being built by the Herrschbitts at Bristol, R. I., for Harold Vanderbilt, W. K. Vanderbilt and Commodore Tod and deliveries are to be completed by August at the latest.

Lieut. Commander John Grady, recruiting officer for the navy in the East, left to-day for Petersburg, Va., where recruiting has not been up to the standards established in New York and New England cities—except those of Vermont.


