PHILADELPHIA, April 18.—John G. Johnson's famous art collection, valued by him at more than \$5,000,000, is given by his will to the City of Philadelphia.

By the terms of the will his handsome residence in the heart of the city and the 600 paintings in contained are to be the property of Philadelphia for use as a public museum to be maintained by the city, provided it accepts the bequest within six months. If it fails to do so the paintings are to go to the Metropolitan Museum of New York.

**500 U. S. RAILWAY MEN TO REBUILD RUSSIAN SYSTEMS**

Plans to Lend New Regime \$2,000,000,000 Also Being Formulated.

WASHINGTON, April 18.—Complete rehabilitation of the crippled Russian railway systems by a large corps of trained American railroad men will be the direct and early result of an appeal to the President from several of Russia's ablest engineers. The new government thus will be strengthened against the pressure to make a separate peace with Germany.

Plans to lend the Russian Government some \$2,000,000,000 out of the new \$5,000,000,000 war bond issue already have been formulated, but American aid is to still further and make effective the expenditure of the great sums of money the New Russian Democracy is to receive from the United States.

Money is recognized as the greatest need of the new Russian Government to maintain its credit, sustain its position and munition the armies in the field, but one of the greatest causes of Russian disaster and inactivity has been the demoralized condition of the transport system, which appears to have broken down at every emergency.

To correct this defect plans are being made to send more than 500 trained American railroad men to Russia to organize and operate her railroads with the efficiency the have built up the American systems.

**SCANDINAVIANS FEAR LOSS OF U. S. SUPPLIES**

Cutting Off of Grain Imports Would Be Disastrous, Says Swedish Premier.

CHRISTIANIA, April 18.—All Scandinavia is worried over the possibility of America shutting off food supplies from neutrals and concentrating on the provisioning of the allies in the war.

"Such a move would be disastrous to us," said Premier Knudson to-day. "It would cut off more than half of our grain supply. All our statesmen, all our people are hoping there will be no such action. It seems incredible that such undesired unfriendliness is seriously contemplated."
