

MATRIMONIAL DRIVE TURNED TO ROUT BY GOVERNMENT BOMB

The Marriage License Bureau is a

peaceful place to-day. Where there has been a bedlam of voices of prospective brides and grooms every day since the United States' participation in the war became a reality, you could have heard a pin drop most of the time this morning. The War Department's decree that all young men between the ages of nineteen and twenty-five who have married since the outbreak of war are liable for military service as if they were single has had an instant effect. More than 6,000 stickers, already

entrenched behind petticoats and kitchen, are doomed. Never was a victory against deliberate quitting more complete. It is common talk over on the east side that parents arranged hasty—very hasty—marriages of young couples, many of whom were scarcely acquainted. It was all a huge, grim joke on Uncle Sam as the fond mothers and fathers of the striplings saw it. Many a "war bride," just to help the brother of a girl friend—very often a young man in whom she was not even interested—would lead him to the altar in the Marriage Chapel. Having done this "favor" as she saw it, she parted then and there from her husband and that ended it. There are ten windows in the Marriage License Bureau. This morning ten clerks peered through them yawning and unemployed, but happy. In the big room outside—practically empty for the first time in many weeks—a grown couple were seated at a table filling in application blanks. The man was about thirty-five and the woman about thirty. She wore a corage spray of lilies of the valley.

"This is like old times," said City Clerk Scully. "You see, a slacker wouldn't invest in flowers for his girl and bouquets were as scarce as heaven. The dodgers will have to fall back to some new line of defense. It won't be around here, at any rate." Yesterday, when the orders from the War Department were posted about the Marriage License Bureau and the Marriage Chapel, they didn't affect the number of marriages greatly. This was because all were in English. Many languages are needed to reach all classes who apply for licenses. But what the notices didn't accomplish yesterday the foreign language papers did.

"The best proof of my contention that slacking was responsible for the abnormal increase in marriages," said City Clerk Scully, "is found in today's figures. From 5 o'clock this morning to 11 o'clock only about thirty-five licenses were issued. That speaks for itself. The slacker is beaten at his own game."


