"Farms for Women," War Relief Slogan for College and Factory Girls

All Plans Completed for the Big Training Farm in the Bronx.

Not merely as a war measure, but to open a new, pleasant, profitable and healthful occupation to college and high school graduates and to underpaid, over-worked factory employees, the National League for Women's Service has started a "back to the farm" campaign in which several hundred women have enlisted. Among them are students from Columbia University, Barnard College, Washington Irving



problem of the woman who works, especially if she works in unattractive and unhealthful surroundings," Mrs. Mary E. Hamilton, Chairman of the agricultural department of the National League for Women's Service, pointed out to me. "If she has not been fortunate enough to get a high school or college education, she will be doomed usually to take the worst jobs the city has to offer. To prepare for farm work, education is not necessary and the results gained are better for the worker. At the demonstration farm very little money will be needed and the course will last only six weeks, which is much shorter preparatory training than is required in any other branch of work.

"There is a lot, you know, in knowing how to do things. With our training we shall eliminate much of the hard labor by showing our students how to work practically and easily. We shall begin with the planting of the crops and lead gradually up to the final stage of canning them. Also the students will be trained in dairying by Miss Beattie Dunlap, and Mr. Crawford, in donating the use of his estate, has given us some pigsties and the pigs with which we shall make the girls acquainted."

The farmerettes will camp on their farm, as Mrs. Hamilton has been giving tents for them. Several scholarships also have been donated to the league by individuals interested in the farm work. Miss Gertrude Robinson-Smith, State Chairman of the league, and Prof. O. S. Morgan of Columbia, are co-operating with Mrs. Hamilton.

The finance committee of the league has raised \$10,000 to Commander E. P. Forshaw of the Naval Militia for use in aerial work at the militia's Bay Shore training station.

At this station nearly fifty young men are preparing for aerial work. They have come from all parts of the country and many of them have left their positions or given up their professions to perform this patriotic duty. The men are building their own mess houses, sleeping quarters and hangars, and spending their own funds. The Aviation Committee is doing its utmost to relieve the financial situation. Since the committee's call for volunteers and funds there have been nearly 200 applications for enlistment. Many of the applicants have offered to pay all or half the expense of their training, and others have interested those who will contribute toward the training fund.

Half the \$10,000 needed for its second Y. M. C. A. unit has been raised by the members of the New York City Woman Suffrage Party. An attempt will be made to collect the additional \$5,000 by a Suffrage sacrifice sale to be held by the War Service Committee of the State Woman Suffrage Party at Nos. 15-17 East Fifty-ninth Street, May 22—May 28. Many society women will act as saleswomen, among them Mrs. F. Louis Slade.
