WOMAN IN POISON TRIANGLE TOLD OF PERIL OF SISTERS

Brooklyn Friends Repeat Mrs. Allen's Forebodings Prior to Texas Tragedy.

Neighbors and friends who for years have known Mrs. Margaret H. Allen, osteopathist, of No. 64 Seventh Avenue, Brooklyn, now under arrest in San Antonio, Tex., with another sister, Miss Alice Herdman, pending the investigation of the death by poisoning at that city of Dr. Sarah Frances Herdman, a third sister, were unable to account to-day for the queer stories told by Mrs. Allen in connection with the mysterious case.

Friends, however, and members of the congregation of the First Church of Christ, the Disciples' Church (not a Christian Science church), which Mrs. Allen attended, spoke in the highest terms of her and said they were confident she would be able to clear herself of any connection with her sister's death.

Talks with these friends show that before leaving for San Antonio on May 3 Mrs. Allen had stated that mysterious enemies were trying to cause the deaths of herself and her two sisters. Mrs. Allen said she had been called to San Antonio by the illness of one of her sisters.

Mrs. L. B. Zelder of No. 98 Park Place, Brooklyn, secretary to the Rev. M. M. Amunson, pastor of the First Church of Christ, said that on Monday last Mr. Amunson received a telegram from Mrs. Allen which read: "Come to San Antonio at once. I want your help. Bring money." None of those who know the woman in Brooklyn had ever heard her speak of any property, but they were under the impression she was in moderate

circumstances. Mrs. Allen has been separated from her husband several years. Her maiden name was Margaret Herdman and the family came from a place near Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., May 17.—With calmness, Mrs. Margaret H. Allen of Brooklyn, N. Y., to-day related to police officials how certain attempts had been made by persons from the East to take the lives of herself and her two sisters, Dr. Sarah Francis Herdman, who now lies in her

coffin, and Miss Alice Herdman, who, with Mrs. Allen, is being held for investigation. Having been summoned by neighbors, who stated that the sisters had been acting mysteriously, the police, Tuesday afternoon, broke into the home and found the body of Dr. Herdman. The other sisters were in the house at the same time. They were not alarmed when they were notified to go to Police Headquarters. They asked that they be allowed to go into their kitchen. This privilege was granted and when they entered that room Mrs. Allen cut a large

grapefruit in two, poured a dark brown, ill-colored liquid on each half and handed one piece to her sister. Detective Froudford, who had followed the women into the kitchen, knocked the pieces of grapefruit from their hands before they had an opportunity to eat any of it.
