Smash! Go Dinner Plates in London Hotel When Diners See German Mark
Lord Beresford Discovers Hated Stamp; Then Luncheon Guests Hurl Table China to Floor.

LONDON, May 25.—Guests at the luncheon of the British Empire Productions Association at the Savoy Hotel smashed their china plates on discovering they were of German manufacture. Lord Beresford, while speaking, happened to pick up a plate and saw the German stamp on its back. "Here's a pretty state of affairs!" he exclaimed. "We have actually been eating off German plates!" Then followed crashes from various parts of the room as one guest after another dashed his plate to the floor. "The Association must see that such a thing as this never happens again," said Lord Beresford. "I don't think I should have enjoyed my luncheon if I had known I was eating off a German plate."

The hotel manager explained subsequently that since the beginning of the war 10,000 German made plates had been given away by the hotel, principally to hospitals, and he thought the stock had been exhausted. He added that since the luncheon he had found one plate in the hotel stores, but was satisfied there were no others.

GAS SET KIMONO AFIRE.
Mrs. Gross Badly Burned. Also Two Mrs. Who Aided Her.

Mrs. Lena Gross, twenty-five, put the baby's bottle in a kettle of water over a gas stove this morning in her apartment at No. 287 Seventh Street.
