**FIFTH ARREST IN PLOT TO STEAL ARMY DRUGS**

Ball of Men Accused of Impeding Medical Supplies for Troops Is Increased.

The fifth arrest in connection with an alleged plot to steal medical supplies, including valuable drugs, from Government depots in this city, was made today when Special Agents Gronwald and Finnolo of the Department of Justice seized Moe Howard, a former Government packer, in front of his home, No. 124 Towson Street. Howard is charged with the theft of 150 packages of cocaine from the United States Medical Supply Depot at No. 537 Greenwich Street. When he was arraigned before Commissioner Hitchcock, Assistant United States Attorney Knox asked that the ball of Henry Clinton, Jack Katz, Herbert Edkins and Robert Levine, arrested Wednesday in connection with the alleged plot, be increased from \$5,000 to \$7,500. Commissioner Hitchcock agreed that the plot gravely impeded the shipment of medical supplies to the troops abroad and those now at the various cantonments, and fixed the new bail. More arrests are expected.

The bride is a first cousin of Howard Elliott, chairman of the Board of Directors of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, and is a graduate of LaGrange College, LaGrange, Mo., of which her uncle, Jeff F. Cook, was President for thirty years. She understood Mrs. Vernon Castle in "Watch Your Step."


