RICHMOND LEADS ALL BOROUGHS IN FOOD THRIFT DRIVE

Twenty Per Cent. of Housewives Fill Out Cards in Economy Canvass.

A tabulation of the results of the first day's canvass to enlist the cooperation of the 1,200,000 housewives in New York City in the food economy campaign shows that the Fifth Assembly District of Queens leads the field with 41 per cent. of the week's quota of pledge cards signed up. The First Assembly District of Brooklyn and the Second Assembly District of Richmond were tied for second place, each with 25 per cent. of the week's quota secured during the first twenty-four hours of the campaign. The five borough districts, with the quotas for the week, the number of returns to the 8 p.m. day and the percentages are as follows:



For an entire borough Richmond leads with 20 per cent. of the week's quota signed up the first day. Queens comes next with over 10 per cent., while Manhattan, Brooklyn and the W. H. I. show 5 to 6 per cent. each. Following are the quotas for each borough, the numbers signed up in each and the percentages:

Mr. Williams told the women that Police Commissioner Woods had instructed his department to co-operate with the canvassers in

any way possible, and Mr. Williams said the Catholic Church of Brooklyn had promised to support the movement in that borough.
