

# THE NEW PLAYS

"The Old Country"  
Has Faversham's Charm.

There is a certain frankness to be found in the acting of William Faversham, together with an easy grace and above all, good-nature, that makes the play in which he appears seem as close to him as home is to all of us. This is the secret of the effect he achieved last night in "The Old Country" at the Thirty-ninth Street Theatre.

Mr. Faversham was even so frank as to say that the play had been "doctored" by George Broadhurst after betraying symptoms of cold, or something of the sort, "on the road."

Such a confession must be good for the soul of the actor-manager who is honest. He takes you into his confidence and leaves the rest to the luck of the theatrical game he is playing. It is sportsman-like—in other words the decent kind of thing for a decent kind of actor to do. Faversham plays fair. His cards are on the table, and he gives you every opportunity to look them over.

As an onlooker therefore I am only too glad to say that "The Old Country" has Faversham's charm—and this means a great deal to playgoers who turn to the stage for good taste. Mr. Faversham is both a gentleman and an actor. He could take the play he now has on his hands and flick it off his finger-tips without the slightest effort. Yet he puts into it so much delicacy of feeling that you respond to the claim he makes upon your possibly sensitive emotions.

As a matter of fact, "The Old Country" is a bit old-fashioned—if you will grant the term. Dion Calthrop, the author of this sentimental romance, seems to have taken his view of life between tea-up-and-sauce in England, with America in the distance. Lacking the vigor and the reality that Arnold Bennett has put into his stories, Mr. Calthrop is content to rest his pen on the sentiment that England accepted, just as it took Jim for breakfast, before the war. The story he tells is extravagantly sentimental. A man without a father to his name comes back from America to wreak vengeance on the dignitaries of an English village who had driven his mother and his own precious self from the place. To accomplish this purpose he brings his mother to the manor house where she had worked as a servant, intent upon establishing her there, without stopping to think she would probably be most uncomfortable. She is even forced to meet the man who should have been her husband, according to

English morality. "Jim" means to be good to his mother, but he really makes it very awkward for her. In the end he wins an unusually good-looking school teacher, and you are left to imagine that they will live happily ever after in America with his mother.

It was the tenderness shown by Mr. Faversham both to the mother and two spinsters that gave the performance an irresistibly human quality. Jane Houston was decidedly attractive as the girl who won the millionaire from America, but she dressed herself in a way that had nothing in common with a simple English village maiden. Both the hat she wore and her silk stockings were quite out of character. Cecelia Radcliffe and Katharine Brook were quaint and charming as the spinsters who made "Jim" the joy of their hearts, and Maude Milton gave a sympathetic performance as the mother placed in embarrassing circumstances and the long-lost father, but the acting generally saved the play from seeming impossibly sentimental.


