

RUNAWAY NEW YORK BOY DIES IN 'NO MAN'S LAND' DEFENDING LISTENING POST

Myron Roth Killed on Christmas Day, Returning Canadian Officer Tells His Father.

Information has just been received by Herman L. Roth, a lawyer, of No. 1475 Broadway, New York, of the death of his son, Myron, on the fighting line in France. It is the first definite news Mr. Roth has had of his son since he disappeared from home Nov. 1, 1914, after the father, on account of the boy's youth, had opposed his desire to go to the war.

Lieut. Spencer A. returned wounded Canadian officer, tells Mr. Roth that he and Myron enlisted in Canada in 1914, young Roth giving a fictitious name. For three years the two trained and fought side by side. Last Christmas, which was young Roth's twentieth birthday, his captain called for four volunteers to go out and defend a listening station in No Man's Land. Myron was one of those accepted, and was killed a few moments after reaching the post.

Mr. Roth has two sons at present in the American service.

GAS KILLS TWO ASLEEP.

Heat From Stove Severs Tube and Fills Room With Vapor. He summoned Dr. Bernhardt from Gouverneur Hospital, but Schneider and Leibisch were dead when help arrived.


