ballot to women but also to a large number of additional male voters. It is the most sweeping measure of enfranchisement in British history. The number of voters will be increased from 8,800,000 to 16,000,000 at least. The men voters will still be in a substantial majority. The qualifying age for men is twenty-one, or if serving in the army or navy nineteen, while no woman under thirty is admitted on any ground. There will still be plural voting, and although both men and women are restricted to not more than two votes each there will be far more men than women to qualify as twice-voters. A woman may have two votes only if she is a university graduate, in which case she has a vote in her home district and also a vote for her university candidate. A man may have two votes under the same conditions, but he may also have two votes if he is a business property owner in another district than his home. The wives of twice-voters will be permitted to select which of their husband's constituencies they will vote in, and they need not announce their selection beforehand.

"WEAKER, WEAKER," WROTE WOMAN WHO TOOK POISON

Fast, Becoming Unconscious, Despondent Wife Penned Note to Husband—Will Recover.

"I am growing weaker—weaker," read the last note written early today by Mrs. Eleanor Kaiser, after she swallowed a quantity of iodine in a room at the Hotel St. Margaret, No. 129 West 47th Street. The note, along with five others, was found by policemen who broke into the room and found Mrs. Kaiser unconscious. Mrs. Kaiser, who is twenty-four years old and the wife of William P. Kaiser of College Point, L. I., has been under treatment for tuberculosis. She escaped from a sanitarium several days ago and rented the hotel room last night. Her notes said she felt she would be better off dead. Mrs. Kaiser described her feelings as the poison began to take effect. The last note ended in a meaningless scrawl, made evidently as she fell unconscious.

Police, summoned by another hotel guest who heard groans, revived Mrs. Kaiser with first aid treatment, and she was later sent to Bellevue Hospital. She will recover.

THEODORE WALTER MYERS, BANKER, POLITICIAN, DEAD

Once Comptroller of New York City Succumbs to Heart Attack at the Age of 73.

Theodore Walter Myers, Comptroller of New York City under Maxwells Hewitt, Grant and Gilroy, and special partner in the banking and brokerage firm of Arthur Lipper & Co., died at his home, No. 44 West 77th Street, early today of heart disease. Mr. Myers, who was in his seventy-third year, had just returned, accompanied by his wife, from Florida, where he had passed the winter. He was born in New York Jan. 11, 1844. In 1884 he organized the banking firm of Theodore W. Myers & Co., which negotiated a loan of \$14,000,000 for the city at 2 1/2 per cent, and to be the lowest rate ever obtained by any city government. In 1902 he retired from active business. Mr. Myers entered New York politics in 1887. In 1914 he was one of those who favored the National Democratic Club's amendments to the Direct Primary Bill, designed to take the primary election machinery of New York City out of the hands of Charles F. Murphy. Mr. Myers was interested in turf sports and was at one time the owner of several valuable racing horses.

CONGRESSMAN INJURED WHILE FLYING FOR U. S. ON THE ITALIAN FRONT

SHOOTS FOUR, KILLS SELF.

Washington Policeman Slays Woman and Wounds Three Others. WASHINGTON, March 20.—Mounted Officer Lawrence H. Farquhar of the Washington police force shot and killed Mrs. Harry White, probably fatally wounded Mrs. Mary Farquhar, his wife; seriously wounded Harry White and Clarence W. Tripplet and then killed himself. The shooting took place at the residence of Harry White, where Mrs. Farquhar, who has been estranged from her husband for some time and had sued him for divorce, was boarding. All Farquhar's victims were in their beds when shot.

TRY TO ROB ENVOY'S HOME.

Three Burglars Flew Residence of U. S. Ambassador in Argentina. BUENOS AYRES, March 20.—Three burglars who entered the home of Frederick J. Stimson, United States Ambassador to Argentina, early today were routed when fired upon by servants. The intruders, who were trying to force the dining room door, abandoned their tools and lantern in their flight.

The Stimson family was asleep when the burglars were discovered. The police found an unidentified man in the neighborhood who had been wounded in the leg. Stimson conferred with the Chief of Police regarding the incident.
