Raisin Recipes

THE sugar situation of the past few months has taught housewives the value of raisins, dates and figs, and these three fruits are now being largely used to conserve sugar.

RAISIN LOAF. Mix together three cups of graham flour, five teaspoonfuls of baking powder and one and a half teaspoonfuls of salt.

RAISIN OATMEAL MUFFINS. Heat one cup of milk and a quarter of a cup of water. To this add one teaspoonful of salt and two tablespoonfuls of shortening.


RAISIN PUDDING. Bring to a boil in a double boiler three cups of milk, three tablespoonfuls of butter and three-fourths of a cup of raisins.

RAISIN FARINA JELLY. To two cups of boiling milk and one cup of boiling water add two large tablespoonfuls of farina and a half cup of raisins and a little salt.

RAISIN BROWN BETTY. Mix three cupfuls of stale bread crumbs with a scant quarter of a cup of cooking oil.

RAISIN SANDWICHES. For the lunch box make sandwiches of raisins and nuts in equal proportions and mix with mayonnaise dressing.
