Army Keeps Details Secret as Prisoner Is Brought Back to Yaphank.

A colored soldier, said to be a member of the 26th Infantry, handcuffed to a white sergeant and accompanied by another sergeant and three privates, each with a revolver attached to his belt, left at 10:30 this morning for Camp Upton, where he will be

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tried by court-martial for the murder on Sunday, May 5, on the outskirts of the camp, of Private Michael Maloney of the Second Outgoing Casuals and Mrs. Rose Harrity of No. 29 Fourth Street, Brooklyn.

The identity of the alleged murderer could not be learned. He remained under guard last night at the Third Branch Detective Bureau, but was not booked.

Major H. H. Walker, Provost Marshal of Camp Upton, was represented by Lieut. Donovan, who said he had no authority to talk. The police declined to say anything because it was an army case, and wouldn't even admit there was such a prisoner.

It was learned, however, that the soldier first admitted to Lieut. Donovan at 7:30 last night that he killed Private Maloney of the 2d Company, outgoing casuals. Later he also admitted he shot Mrs. Harrity, Mrs. Harrity, whose home was at No. 29 Fourth Street, Brooklyn, was walking through the camp with Maloney when they were murdered.

The Provost Marshal's office at Camp Upton would say nothing about the confession early to-day, and would not even admit it had heard of one. An announcement was sent out from Camp Upton by Major Walker on Monday that the man believed to have committed the double murder had been caught in Virginia, and that "guards have left this camp to bring him back for trial here by general court-martial."

The murderer escaped in the woods after the shooting, but was seen by several sentries. The military authorities have never admitted he was a soldier, though it has been generally understood he was. It is probable the man who confessed, and who was taken to camp to-day, is the one arrested in Virginia.

Some Butchers Even Suggest an Entire Month Without Meat for the Nation.

Paris, May 15.—Beginning to-day, France will go short of meat three whole days a week. Such a measure will necessarily cause grumbling in certain quarters, yet the whole French population will bend to the law and put up with such restrictions as long as they are necessary to a victory for the country's cause. France has already experienced

meatless days. Last year two such days a week were enforced. At that time the restriction was not a success, for buyers would purchase enough meat the day preceding the meatless days to carry them over. This time, however, no one will be able to buy enough for that. To-day the meat supply was rationed, about three ounces being apportioned to each person.

Meat cards have not yet been introduced here, but it is thought we shall have them soon instead of meatless days. There is even a possibility of having both.

One hears many opinions expressed here as to the new meat regulations. While some butchers reckon the new law necessary they do not think it is properly applied. They suggest a whole month, from July 15 to Aug. 15, without meat at the time of the year

when vegetables are more abundant than at present.

U. S. ARMY IN TRENCHES THANKS SHIPYARD ARMY

Pershing Says Builders' Support Is Essential to Their Brothers on the Battle Line.

WASHINGTON, May 15.—Gen. Pershing, in a cablegram to-day to Chairman Hurley of the Shipping Board, extended the army's congratulations on the record-breaking industrial feat of launching a steel ship in twenty-seven days from the time the keel was laid. He said:

"Am pleased to say that the spirit of patriotism shown by men building ships is fully recognized and appreciated by their American brothers on the battle line. 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
