

WAR FILM BARRED FOR BROKEN RULE, CREEL DECLARES

Calls Charge of "Hearst Influence" as "Absurd as Indecent."

WASHINGTON, June 24.—Declaring that the motion picture "The Yanks Are Coming" was refused the necessary official sanction for display in New York because the Universal Company made the film "in open disregard and defiance of established procedure," George Creel today accepted full responsibility for stopping the film.

The charge that "Hearst influence" guided him to protect the Hearst-Pathé film concern, Creel branded as "merely to muddy the water, and as absurd as it is indecent."

Creel's statement follows:

"The motion picture, 'The Yanks Are Coming,' was refused the necessary official sanction because every detail of the film making was in open disregard and even defiance of established procedure. No photographs may be made in a factory going Government war work without formal permit, issued after investigation. The Universal did not have these permits, and made no effort to get them.

"Also, after making the pictures without permits, the Universal planned a commercial exploitation of the film for its own profit, a privilege denied every other motion picture producer in the United States, at one time or another.

"The only question at issue is whether private profit shall have the power to nullify the Government's efforts to protect its military secrets. The charge of 'Hearst influence' is merely an attempt to muddy the water, and is as absurd as it is indecent.

"No one in connection with this organization had responsibility in the matter save myself. The decision was my own, and others merely carried out my instructions."

Secretary of War Baker will be asked to view "The Yanks Are Coming," a moving picture of airplane manufacture and flights, and decide whether it should be put before the public. The picture, a Universal Film Company production, was to have been shown last night at the

SON OF COL. ROOSEVELT, MAJOR THEODORE, CITED FOR GALLANTRY IN ACTION

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMY IN FRANCE, June 24 (Associated Press).—Major Theodore Roosevelt Jr. has been cited by the General Commanding the troops to which his unit is attached for "conspicuous gallantry" in action during the operations connected with the capture and subsequent defense of Cantigny. The citation says:

"During an enemy raid he displayed high qualities of courage and leadership in going forward to supervise in person the action of one of the companies of his battalion, which had been attacked.

"On the day of our attack upon Cantigny, although gassed in the lungs and gassed in the eyes to blindness, Major Roosevelt refused to be removed and retained the command of his battalion under a heavy bombardment throughout the engagement."

C. R. Byour, Associate Chairman of the Creel committee, told newspaper men the Creel committee had not ordered the suppression of the picture, but had told the Wright-Dayton Company that it would not give a permit to show it because no official permit had been granted for making it.

CANAL ZONE DECREES RIGID

Liquor License Boosted Ten Times in Plan to Better Conditions.

PANAMA, June 24.—The Government today issued two decrees looking toward alleviation of the conditions which have caused the American military authorities in the Canal Zone to prohibit American soldiers from visiting Panama and Colon. Prince Lubomirsky outlined the Government programme, which includes the presentation of a bill for military legislation. The speech called upon the Central Powers for the realization of Poland's independence in close understanding with the Central Empire.


