BLACKMAIL PLOT ON MORGAN FAMILY LEADS TO ARREST

Conspirators Wrote That Financier Had Been Inoculated With Deadly Germ.

LANSING, Mich., Sept. 17.—On a charge of trying to blackmail the members of the family of J. Pierpont Morgan of New York, J. B. Thorn, fifty-one years old, janitor for the Lansing State Journal, is held by the post-office authorities in \$10,000 bail.

Letters mailed in this city began to reach Mr. Morgan and his daughter, Mrs. Jane Nichols of Glen Cove, L. I., a year and a half ago.

In the first of them the writer claimed to represent a gang of desperate men who were in close touch with the Morgan family.

He then declared that the entire Morgan family had been secretly inoculated with a disease germ that would cause their death in three years.

That is, unless Mr. Morgan paid \$20,000 for an antidote for the disease germ, which the writer said he alone was able to furnish.

A plan by which the \$20,000 was to be placed in the hands of some unnamed Lansing man as trustee was suggested a few weeks ago, and Mr. Morgan pretended to agree.

A special delivery letter and a package of fake money were mailed, and when Thorn received them yesterday he was arrested.

In one of the letters it was asserted that the death a few years ago of J. P. Morgan sr., had been caused by an inoculation of the mysterious germ.

In specifying a "trustee" for the \$20,000 demanded by the blackmailers, it was explained this was to insure to the Morgans the success of the "antidote," and that the money was to be held two years.

The police say that all the letters to Mrs. Nichols were written on a typewriter of an old make with a distinctive type face, and that such a machine was found in Thorne's room.

FOUR BROTHERS ACCUSED OF \$200,000 SWINDLE

Solomons Said to Have Obtained Goods From Twenty-Five Firms and Made No Returns.

Four brothers, charged on a Grand Jury indictment with having operated a swindle by which they obtained goods valued at \$200,000 from twenty-five or more firms, were arraigned in the Jefferson Market Court this morning and held under \$2,500 bail for examination Oct. 1. The scheme they are accused of having used was to obtain goods on memorandum and make no returns.

They are Kail, George, Elias and Joseph Solomon; the first three named living at No. 479 West 116th Street, and Joseph at No. 224 Amsterdam Avenue.

Kail and George were in the commission business at No. 136 Broadway and Elias and Joseph operated the Southern Dry Goods Company at No. 751 Broadway.

WANTS BOND TAX CUT OUT.

Comptroller Says Levy on Municipal Securities Would Burden City.

Comptroller Charles L. Craig today sent a message to the Members of Congress asking them to eliminate from the revenue bill before its passage the provision levying a tax on incomes derived from State and municipal securities.

He states that such a tax would be a burden not upon the holders of such securities but on the State, cities and towns. The proposed tax would compel cities and States to pay an increased rate of interest on their bonds long after the tax on their income had been repealed.

In the case of New York, Mr. Craig contends, the loss of revenue and added costs due to war conditions will run well into the millions.

ASK 5,000 TONS OF CLOTHES

Red Cross to Collect for Destitute in France and Belgium.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15.—Wanted—five thousand tons of clothing for destitute people in occupied Belgium and France.

At the call of Herbert Hoover, the American Red Cross next Monday will start collecting these garments. Only substantial garments are needed—no ball room gowns and slippers—for the 18,000,000 people who will wear them hard and long.

Furniture Making Restricted.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17.—An order restricting the manufacture of furniture has been issued by the Conservation Division of the War Industries Board.

WOMAN HELD FOR PERKINS THEFT REMAINS SILENT

Police Unable to Obtain Clue to Her Identity—Will Be Sentenced Thursday.

Although questioned in hourly relays, the mysterious young woman held for the theft of a purse from the home of George W. Perkins in Riverdale, refused to tell much of herself to-day. It is the seventeenth day she has been under arrest, and the police have not been able to obtain a clue to her identity.

The prisoner said that her real name was Elizabeth Rose, which she wrote on a card yesterday; that her parents have been dead many years; that she has a brother whom she recently saw in New Haven and that she was in New York for two weeks prior to her arrest. Then she reverted to silence.

The girl, who is about twenty-three years old, has been convicted of larceny and will be sentenced Thursday. She may be sent to a reformatory or to the penitentiary for from six months to three years.

Mrs. Perkins says that if the girl's mind is found to be affected the case will be dropped, but that if, as the police believe, she is shielding some one else, the law will be allowed to take its course.


