

## BUGLER WOUNDED IN 54 PLACES BY SHRAPNEL SHELL

Rahway Youth, Injured While  
Acting as Runner, Ready to  
Go Back at Germans.

Wounded by shrapnel in fifty-four places, Wilbur Morris, nineteen years old, grandson of Mr. and Mrs. William O. Morris of No. 22 Central Avenue, Rahway, is ready to tackle the Germans again. Young Morris is a native of Rahway and went overseas as a bugler in Company I, 127th Infantry, 82d Division.

"I have been almost all over France since I was hurt, in two different hospitals and three different camps," the bugler wrote in a letter to his aunt, Miss Hazel Morris. "I will tell you how I was hurt. While we were in the first line trenches I was sent with a message to the second line trench. I was going along a narrow road between the two lines when I heard one of those large shells coming singing through the air.

"I was not sure whether it was coming my way or not, so I stopped walking. Then I felt sure it was coming my way. I made a leap for the side of the road, but I was too late. It dropped a few yards ahead of me and exploded.

"It threw me fifteen feet. When I picked myself up I was covered with dirt and blood, so I made a bee line for a first aid station about a mile away.


"When they had dressed my hands I felt blood running on my arms and chest and I began to get scared. Well, in about four hours I was in a French hospital on an operating table.

"When I came out of the other a nurse was sitting by my bedside. She showed me the pieces of shrapnel they had taken from my body. The doctor told me I was punctured in fifty-four places, mostly in the chest and stomach. I am all right now and hope to get back in action soon."


