

**Jewish Soldiers Formed to Help Slav Government.**  
 AMSTERDAM, Nov. 12.—A meeting of 6,000 Jewish soldiers formed a Soldiers' and Workmen's Council and occupied Leopoldsdorf, an eastern quarter of Vienna, according to a Vienna despatch, which quotes the Jewish Correspondence Bureau. Jewish Soldiers' and Workmen's Councils have been established at Prague, Theresienstadt, Olmutz and other places and have been welcomed by the Czechs.

**\$900,000 GIFTS OF STANDARD OIL BOOST WAR FUND**

Other Large Contributions Come In, but New York Has Not Yet Hit Stride.

The New York division of the United War Work Campaign has received a gift of \$100,000 from the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey and a gift of \$200,000 from the Standard Oil Company of New York. These sums are only a part of the total gifts to be made by the oil concerns and distributed through the country.  
 Other large contributions are being received with each mail delivery, but it is reported that New York has not yet struck the pace which must be maintained if the district is to reach its quota. The quota for the district is \$35,000,000. The whole country is to raise at least \$170,000,000.

Marie Dressler, calling herself "The Seven-in-One Lady" and wearing a fearful and wonderful gown in which all the seven war work organizations were represented, started up Manhattan this morning to collect \$1,000,000.

**U. S. NAVY HAS CONVOYED 900,000 AMERICANS ABROAD**

Mine Barrage 360 Miles Long, Laid From Scotland to Norway, Another Achievement.

LONDON, Nov. 12.—Some of the accomplishments of the American Navy may now be made public.  
 From American naval sources, it is learned that the American Navy so far has provided escort for 900,000 troops, which is nearly 50 per cent. of the total of American troops in France. American ships also escorted 27 per cent. of Allied and neutral shipping, including merchantmen, supply ships, munitions ships and troop ships.  
 A mine barrage 360 miles long—the longest in the world—has just been completed from Scotland to Norway, completely enclosing the North Sea. The American Navy laid 80 per cent. of those mines, with about 57,000 American-made specially designed mines. This is regarded as one of the greatest naval feats in history.
